Outraging vs. Indecent Exposure

There is a misconception that someone convicted of urinating in public or "Outraging Public Decency" must register as a sex offender. No one convicted in either state or municipal court for Outraging Public Decency will have to register as a sex offender.

Indecent Exposure occurs when one "lewdly exposes his genitals in a public place." Any person convicted of Indecent Exposure will be required to register as a sex offender for at least 15 years.

We listed convicted sex offenders and mapped their registered addresses beginning on Page 8.

Keep your garage door closed. It only takes a moment for a thief to take your property from an opened garage door. The door into your house from the garage is usually not as secure as an entry door. Once inside your garage the thief has easy access to your home.

From the Major's Desk...

The Tulsa Police Department sent 8 officers from the Disaster Response Team, DaRt, to Joplin this week to assist first responders in their efforts to rescue citizens in the aftermath of Sunday's tornado. Door-to-Door Solicitation

We were recently asked whether or not permits are required for door-to-door sales. The City of Tulsa does not currently require a permit or peddler's license.

Some of these folks are legitimate salespeople, trying to earn a living. Some are attempting to earn money for school events or trips. There is nothing criminally wrong with such endeavors. You need to determine whether the wares sold are a good value. It's buyer beware.

Unfortunately, other solicitors may be trying to scam you out of your money, or casing the neighborhood with the intent to steal your property.

In Issue 1 we reported that individuals were posing as Tulsa University students, seeking solicitations to benefit student groups or the University. TU officials stated their students groups do not engage in door-to-door solicitations.

Most homicides in Tulsa have nothing to do with the average citizen of Tulsa. Usually, homicide victims have some relationship to their killer.

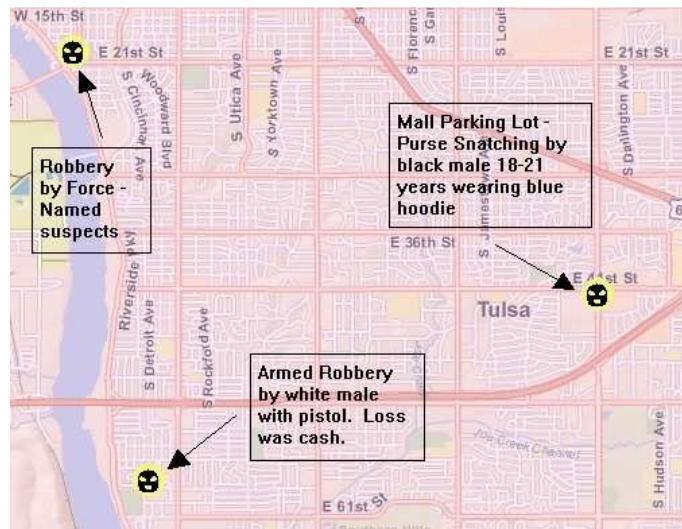
Sexual Assault

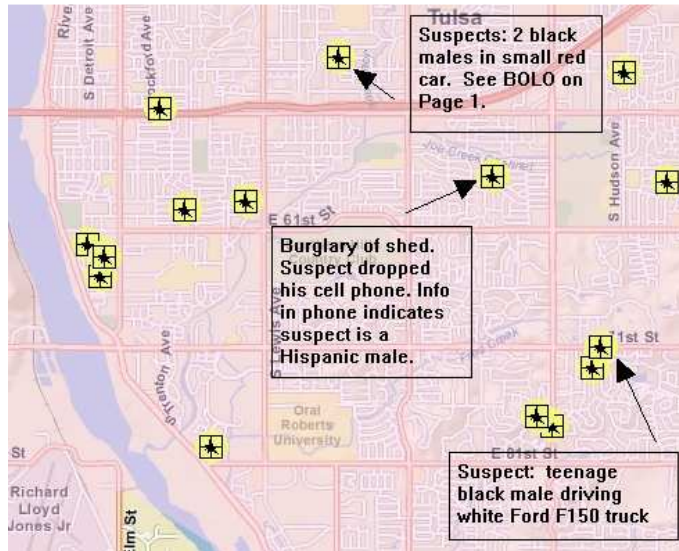
Crime Bulletin

Burglary is the breaking and entry into homes, businesses, and other structures for the purpose of committing a crime.

Residential burglaries usually occur in the daytime when most residents are not home. Most burglars do not want to confront someone in the home. The most common tactic is to knock and see if someone answers the door. The suspect asks for directions or a non-existent person. If no one answers, the burglar breaks into the home.

Commercial burglaries generally occur when businesses are closed, at night or on weekends and holidays.

2 Commercial Burglaries in the Riverside Division last week

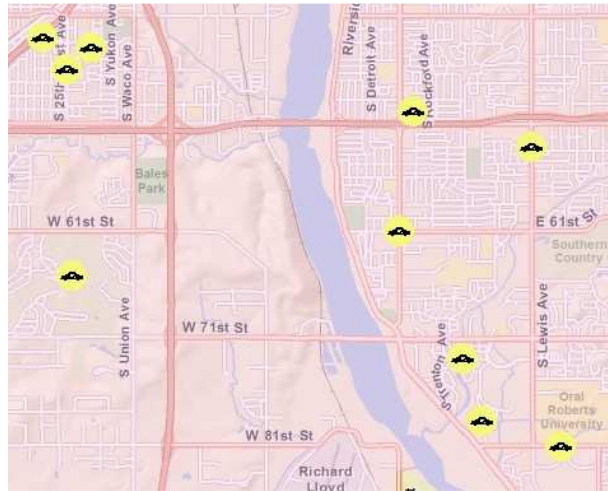

The Lakewood Heights Alert Neighbors report their residents receiving such solicitations. **This is a scam.** Notify us if someone claims to be soliciting for TU.

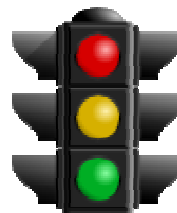
Another group was seeking books to benefit Family and Children's Services. These alert citizens called FCS and learned **this was a scam also.**

What should you do if a solicitor knocks on your door?

Remember that you are under no obligation to make any purchase or donation. If the solicitor does not accept no for an answer, close the door and call police. Try to have a good description including cars for responding officers.

Confirm that the solicitation is legitimate before parting with your money. Call the organization supposedly benefitting from the solicitation.

Never allow a stranger into your home.
