CRIME AWARENESS INFORMATION

The following information relates to crimes that have occurred during the previous week. Below, you will see a brief description of each crime type and some explanatory notes. The icon that will be used on the map is given with the crime type description. The map is designed to give you enough information to see crimes occurring near you, but should not compromise any individual's privacy. Please understand that it would be too labor intensive to provide exact addresses, dates, or times for each individual crime. When I am able, I will provide you with suspect and vehicle information tied to particular crimes. If you do not see a map with your neighborhood for a crime type, then good for you! Your area was either not victimized or had minimal activity with little to no information that would assist you. Keep your eyes open and work hard to keep it that way!

I will also do my best to provide you information on arrests for various crimes so that you can take that information into account as you assess the safety of your homes and businesses. As these sometimes occur weeks afterward, we do not always know when they occur. For example, when a patrol officer arrests someone for a burglary warrant, the location or particulars of the crime are not detailed in the warrant. It would take time to research that case and find what crime the warrant was issued in relation to. The patrol officer does not need that information to book the arrestee in and does not have time to do the research.

The Citizen's Crime Commission is an organization that as a part of its mission assists citizens in organizing and sustaining Alert Neighbor and Citizen's Alert Patrol groups. This includes facilitating communication with law enforcement. If you need assistance with forming a new Alert Neighbor group or getting the most out of the one you belong to, or forming Citizen's Alert Patrol group, the Citizen's Crime Commission can assist you. If you would like an officer who patrols your area to attend a meeting, please make that request through Carol Bush with the Citizen's Crime Commission. HOMICIDE

I will plot this category and give you basic information on these crimes. They generally do not pertain to anything that would affect you as an individual. Most homicides in Tulsa have nothing to do with the honest citizens of Tulsa. Rest assured, if information points to a contributing factor in our control, such as the way in which a nightclub operates or chronic drug dealing at a location, I will inform you and deal with it. HOMICIDES



No homicides to report from last week. Out of the 20 homicides city wide year to date, we have only three homicides in the Mingo Valley area. R RAPE

MVD averages about 5 rapes a month. We rarely have a stranger rape. Rapes generally involve domestic situations or acquaintance situations which generally do not present an opportunity for action. For this reason, and in order to protect the anonymity of victims, I will not routinely plot rapes. Rest assured that if a stranger rape occurs, I will notify you. 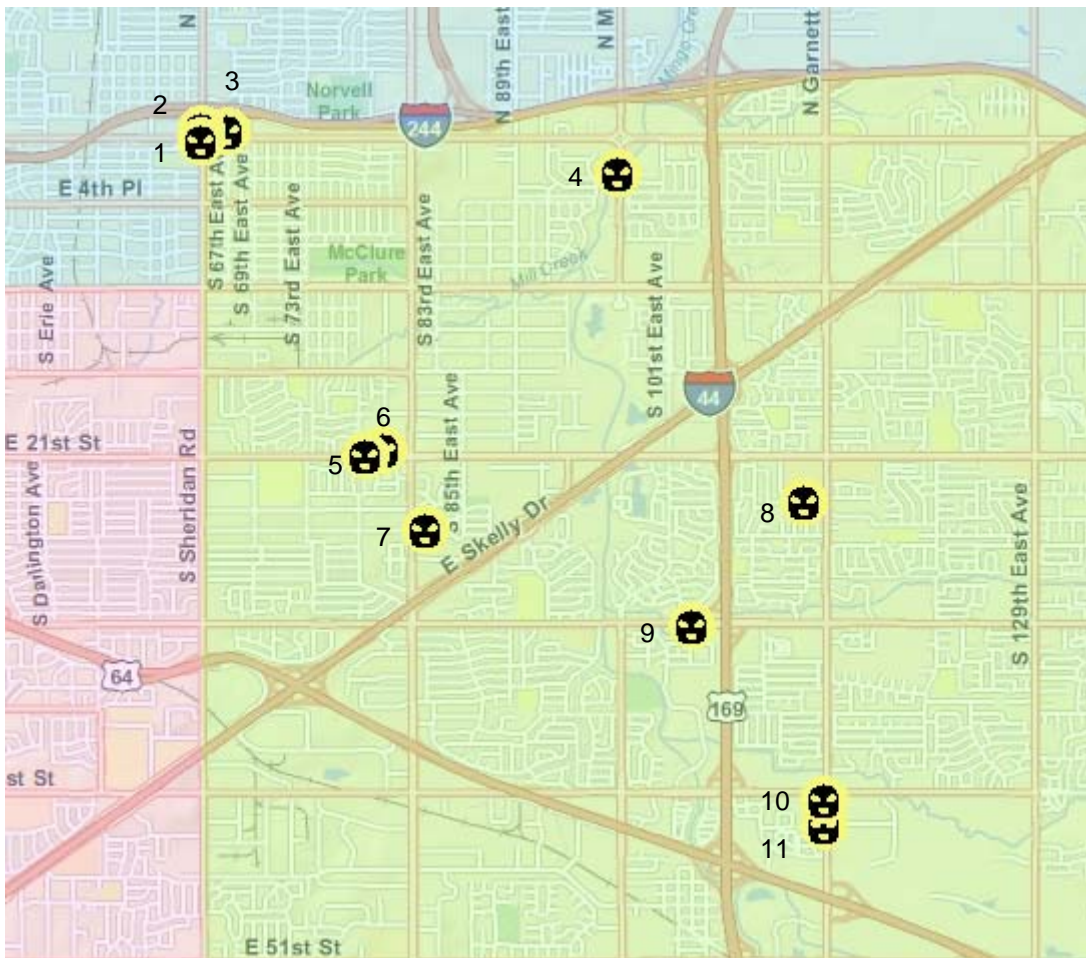
RAPES



1. **6500 blk of E. 21st Place: 06/22: evening:** Victim stated she had been drinking vodka in her boyfriend's car when they got in fight and she left walking towards Sheridan Road. Two males jumped from some bushes and held the victim against her will behind some bushes and raped the victim. Suspects are two unknown males with no additional information.

👤 ROBBERY

This category refers to theft of property from a person or business where force or fear is used. It can involve a weapon or no weapon. Home invasion robberies will be mapped. Nearly ALL home invasion robberies are tied to drug dealing, gambling, or certain knowledge of money in the home. Nearly ALWAYS, the suspects are known to the victim. If we experience a home invasion that does not fit this profile, I will notify you. Robbery Comments

1. **6/25 1:45 p.m. at 15 S. Sheridan Road.** The person reporting is working behind the counter at the Radio Shack when a b/m suspect enters the business. The suspect produces a black revolver and demands that the employee put cash into a trash bag. He then orders the employee to back room where the suspect has him fill the bag with iPhones. The suspect then flees the store on foot. The suspect is described as a b/m 510-600 feet tall, 160 pounds, 25-30 years of age.
2. **6/22 8:11 p.m. at 35 S. Sheridan Road.** An employee with Pizza Hut is delivering a pizza to the Days Inn at the listed location. He goes to the room that the order was supposed to be for, but the occupant denies ordering any pizza. The employee leaves the room and is then approached by the suspect. The suspect grabs a pizza from the employee and runs from the scene. The suspect is described as an Indian or Hispanic male, 5'11" tall, 180 pounds, and 30 years of age.
3. **6/24 11:22 p.m. at 23 N. 67th E. Avenue.** The night clerk at the Aquinas Inn and Suites is approached by a b/f at the front desk. The suspect produces a handgun and demands money. The clerk is compliant but has trouble opening the cash drawer. The suspect then fires one round from the pistol into the ceiling and tells the clerk to hurry up. After getting the money, the suspect flees on foot. The suspect is described as a b/f, 503-505 feet tall, 170 pounds, and 22-25 years of age. A possible suspect was developed at the scene and the case is ongoing.
4. **6/26 1:05 a.m. at 300 S. Mingo Road.** The victim is in his apartment when there is a knock at the door. His girlfriend opens the door and three b/m's enter the apartment. One suspect has a pistol and one of the others is holding what appears to be a tazer. The three suspects begin to assault the victim. The suspects then begin to search the residence as if they are looking for something. The suspects leave a short time later. Two of the suspects are described as 600-602 feet tall and skinny. The third suspect is described as 5'07" tall and 200 pounds.
5. **6/22 9:35 a.m. at 7737 E. 21st Street.** The owner of the El Tarjetero convenience store is working when two w/m's enter the store. They suspects kick in the door to the office and one suspect fires a shot at the owner but misses. The suspects take the contents of the cash drawer and run out of the store. The suspects are seen by a witness leaving the scene in a 1990's white Jeep Cherokee. Kenneth and Michael Harris are later arrested for the robbery.
6. **6/26 5:45 a.m. at 1700 S. 79th E. Avenue.** The three victims are in the residence when there is a knock at the door. One of the victims opens the door and four suspects enter the residence. One of the suspects is armed with a handgun and demands all of their money. Two of the suspects gather up what money there is along with cell phones and a television. The suspects then run out of the residence and the suspect that has the gun fires a round into the ground. The suspects are described as three w/m's and one b/m. The 3 w/m are described as 507-509 feet tall, medium build, and in their twenties. The b/m is described as 5'10" tall and chunky.
7. **6/25 11:59 p.m. at 8300 E. 25th Place.** The victim is in her residence asleep when she hears a noise coming from her son's bedroom. When she walks into the bedroom she is confronted by a b/m with a silver handgun with another b/m in the corner. They demand money and then leave after locking the victim and her infant son in the bathroom. The suspects are described as b/m's wearing all dark clothing and had their faces covered from the eyes down. The first suspect is 600-602 feet tall, 170-180 pounds, and approximately 18-20 years of age. The second suspect is 508-510 feet tall, 160-170 pounds, and approximately 18-20 years of age.

Robbery Comments Continued

8. **6/23 12:53 hours at 11300 E. 24th Street.** The victim is in her residence when there is a knock at the door. Her boyfriend answers the door and a b/m asked for Derrick. The boyfriend tells him there is no Derrick that lives there and the suspect pulls out a handgun and points it at him. The boyfriend slams the door and prevents the suspect from forcing the door open. The suspect then flees the scene on foot. The suspect is described as a b/m, 6'00", skinny, and approximately 23-27 years of age. A witness said that he saw the suspect flee the scene and get into a black vehicle.
9. **6/23 1:25 a.m. at 10220 E. 31st Street.** The victim stops at the QuikTrip to get fuel on his way home. He is approached by three b/m's while he is at the gas pump. The first suspect asked him for a cigarette and then one of the suspects sticks a small revolver in his rib cage. The third suspect then reaches into his front pants pocket and takes the victim's money. The first suspect then pulls out a handgun and demands any other money the victim has. A car pulling into the parking lot scares the suspects off and they run towards the Salida Creek Apartments. The suspects are described as b/m's, 506-600 tall, and approximately 18-20 years of age.
10. **6/23 10:00 p.m. at 4300 S. Garnett Road.** The victim is walking through the courtyard of the apartment complex when he is approached from behind by two b/m's. One of the suspects demands his money and the victim can see a gun in the other suspect's waistband. He gives the suspects his wallet and then takes off running. Joshua Graves and Demitri King are later located and arrested for the robbery.
11. **6/24 11:20 p.m. at 4122 S. Garnett Road.** The victim is in the drive-thru of McDonalds when she is approached by two b/m's. One of the suspects points a gun at her and demands her money. She complies and the suspects then flee on foot. Joshua Graves and Demitri King are later located and arrested for the robbery.
12. **6/25 9:00 p.m. at 18 N. 193rd E. Avenue.** The victim is walking out of the QuikTrip and is confronted by a w/m at the side of the building. The suspect tries to pull her purse out of her hands and she struggles with him. The suspect is able to wrestle the purse from her and flees on foot. She begins yelling and bystanders are able to chase the suspect down. The purse is recovered but the suspect is able to flee on foot. A witness stated that he knows the individual and gave the suspect's name to police. The suspect is a w/m, 4'08" feet tall, 100 pounds, and 15 years of age.

BURGLARY

This category will include breaking and entering homes, businesses, garages, or sheds for the purpose of committing a crime. It does not apply to any sort of trespassing. Although technically classified as larcenies by the FBI, for the sake of simplicity I will include burglaries from vehicles (BFVs) in this category. Residential burglaries predominantly happen during the day when no one is home. 1st degree burglaries, which are burglaries that occur when someone is home, are primarily related to domestics or happen when a burglar makes a mistake. Intentional 1st degree burglaries for the purpose of theft are extremely rare. I will advise you if we identify incidents of that nature. 2100 blk of S 99 EA – 06252011 between 02:20 and 03:00- Attempt to enter through bedroom window. Occupant was home and scared off would-be intruder(s).

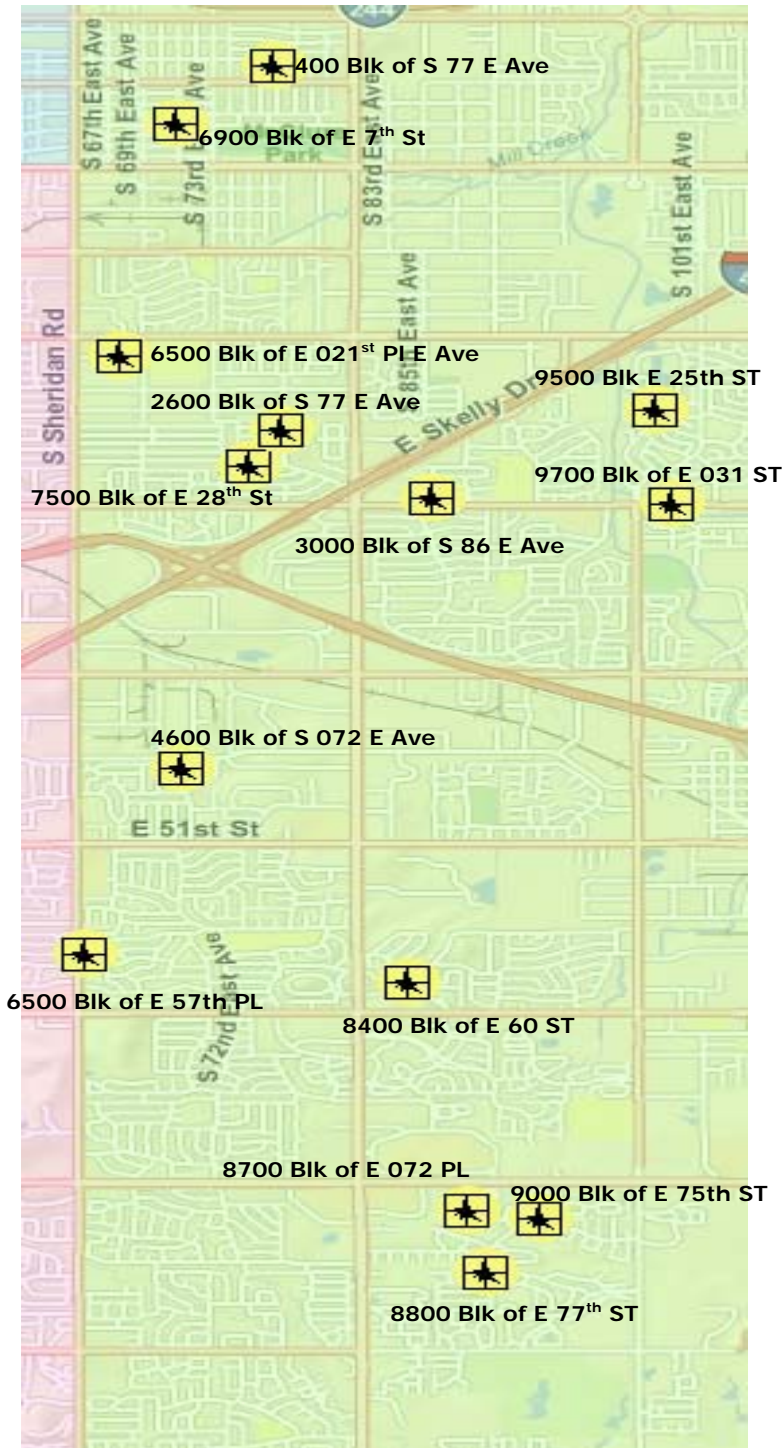
2300 blk of S 96 EA - 06212011 between 05:00 and 06:00– Front door kicked in while resident was sleeping and video games were stolen.

10600 blk of E 33 PL – 06212011 between 20:52 and 23:16 – Alarm company notified resident of motion sensor trip. Window on west side was broken, allowing access to door lock. Power to house had been turned off and an attempt was made to cut the telephone line. Jewelry, cash, credit cards and checkbook were taken.

4800 blk of S 69 EA - 06202011 19:45– Suspects rang doorbell, resident was home but hid. Suspects then went to rear, broken window and gained entry. Laptop and two Razor scooters were taken.

8100 blk of E 60th ST. - between 06252011 2330 and 06262011 0300- Access was made through French doors that had not been secured properly. Electronics and two bass guitars were taken.

400 blk of S 77th E. Ave - 06/23/2011 between 13:00 and 16:30 – Front door pried open and electronics as well as safe with paperwork were taken.

6900 blk of E 7th St - 06/21/2011 between 07:00 and 18:15 – Entry made by kicking-in the side garage door. Wiring to home was cut at exterior of home. Home was ransacked and electronics as well as a handgun were taken.

6500 blk of E. 21st PI - 06/22/2011 between 10:10 and 11:45 – Resident returned home to find front door unlocked. Only item missing was a memory card from a camcorder.

2600 blk of S 77th E Ave - 06/21/2011 between 14:00 and 21:00 – Suspect gained entry by prying open an exterior door. Taken were credit cards, electronics, jewelry and large electric tools. Suspect is believed to have used a blanket taken from the home to remove all of the loot.

7500 blk of E 28th St - 06/25/2011 19:00 and 06/26/2011 06:45 – Entry made by kicking-in garage door. Electronics, jewelry and a cordless drill were taken.

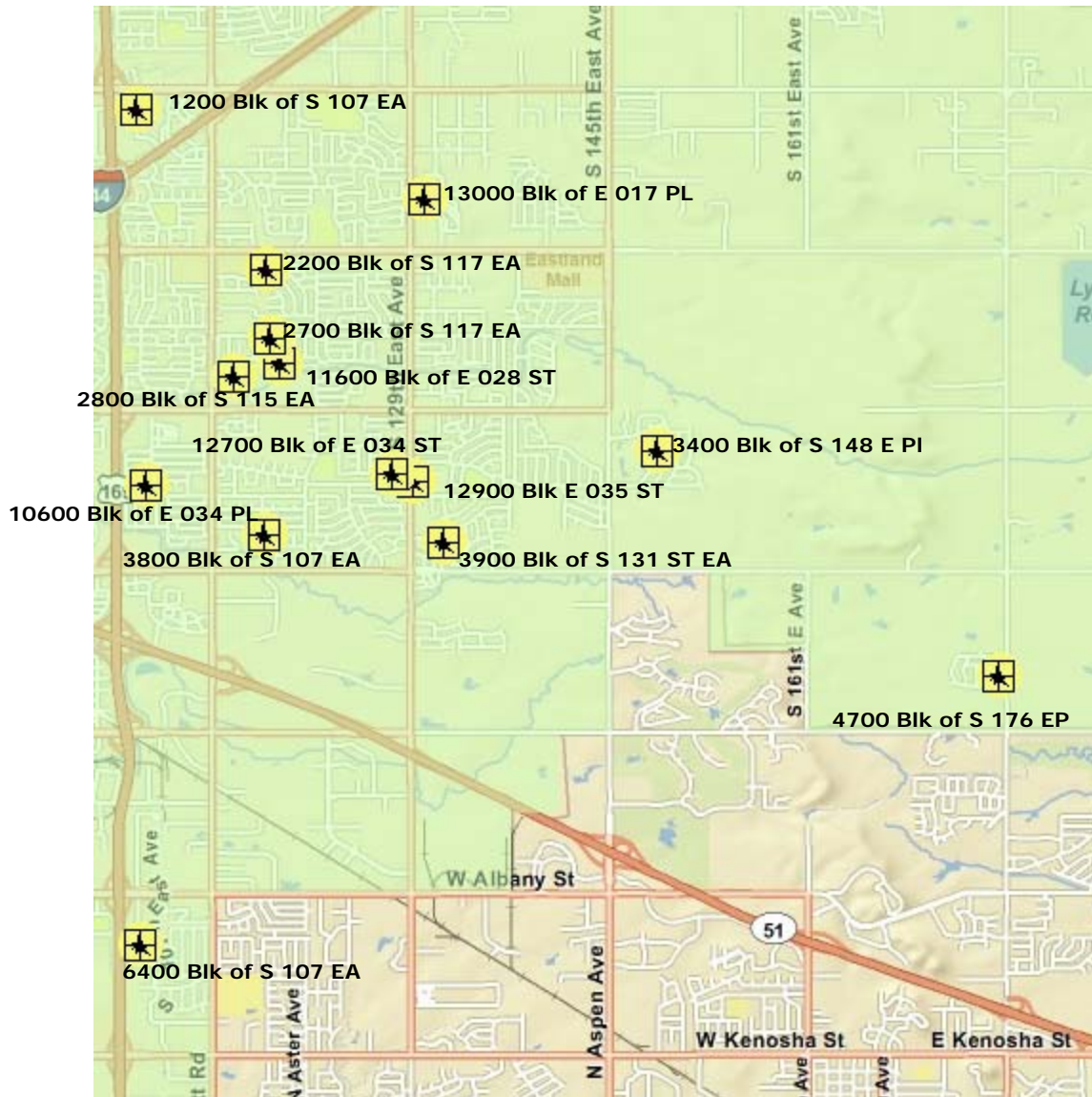

1200 Blk of S 107 EA 06/23/2011 between 11:40 and 15:40 – Front door was open but there were no signs of forcible entry. Victim has identified a possible suspect. Currency, jewelry and clothing were taken.

13000 Blk of E 17th PI 06/25/2011 between 06:00 and 06:30 – Occupant heard noises but did not investigate. Awoke later to find windows had been broken and electronics taken.

2200 Blk of S 117th EA 06/20/2011 between 12:14 and 22:20 – Rear glass door has been forced open. Electronics, jewelry and guns were taken.

2700 Blk of S 117th EA 06/23/2011 between 08:00 and 20:00 – Suspects entered through an unsecured garage door. A large TV and a girl's bicycle were taken.

11600 blk of E 28th St between 06/25/2011 16:30 and 06/26/2011 00:22 – Burglary believed to be committed by resident's relative. Entry made through unlocked rear door and although a TV was damaged, the only items taken were prescription pills.

2800 blk of S 115th EA 06/21/2011 between 10:00 and 10:46 – Apartment management interrupted suspects who were attempting to make entry by cutting the screen off the window to access the door lock.

3900 Blk of S 131st EA -06/22/2011 between 08:00 and 14:00 – An unknown object was used to force in the rear door. Electronics, cash, jewelry and a safe were taken.

12700 Blk of E 34th St – 06/25/2011 between 11:30 and 16:30 – Suspects threw 12" patio stone through bottom portion of bedroom window to gain entry. They attempted to steal two TVs but dropped one in the front yard. Two suspects were named by a neighbor as having been overheard talking about the burglary.

4700 Blk of S 176 EP – 06/20/2011 between 08:00 and 17:00 – Exterior side door leading to garage was kicked-in. Alarm system had been deactivated. Electronics, men's clothing and other articles and four guitars were taken.

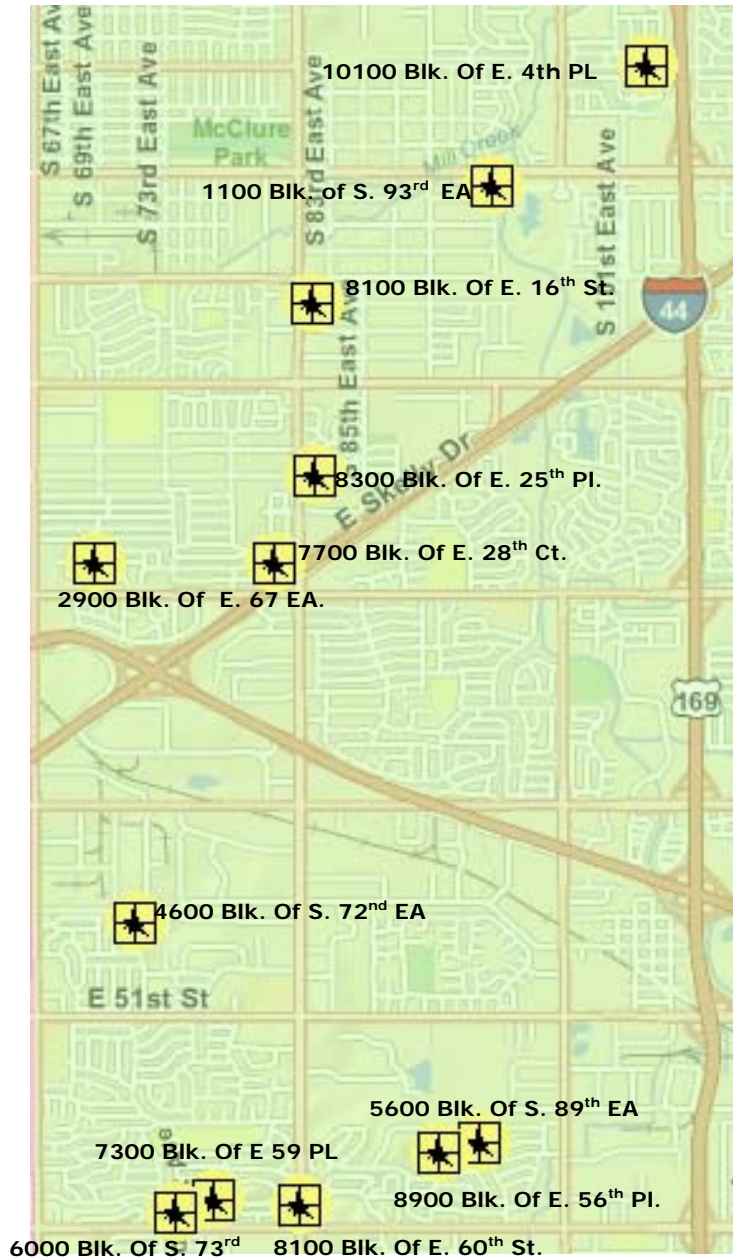

Two were on foot peeking into windows and two others were in a black Chevrolet Suburban with black wheels and dark tinted windows. The worker stated that when the subjects saw him they took off running and got into the Suburban with the other two.

10600 Blk of E 34th PI between 06/23/2011 19:00 and 06/24/2011 17:20 – Master bedroom window had been broken out using a patio chair from the back yard. Resident is out of town and had asked relative to watch the house. Relative noted the damage but could not ascertain loss at this time.

12900 blk of E 35th St 06/21/2011 between 08:00 and 23:30 – suspects kick-in the front door and ransacked the apartment. One TV and one laptop were taken. Neighbors reported hearing multiple people in the apartment while victim was out.

3800 Blk of S 118th EA 06/20/2011 between 08:30 and 13:45 – Entry made through sliding glass door. When returning home, victim noted a small, older tan Chevy parked in front of her house with passenger door open. Woman approached from driver's side when victim parked in driveway. Victim believes accomplice was inside the home while the driver was distracting her. Once inside the home, victim noticed house had been ransacked, medications had been gone through and a jewelry box had been taken.

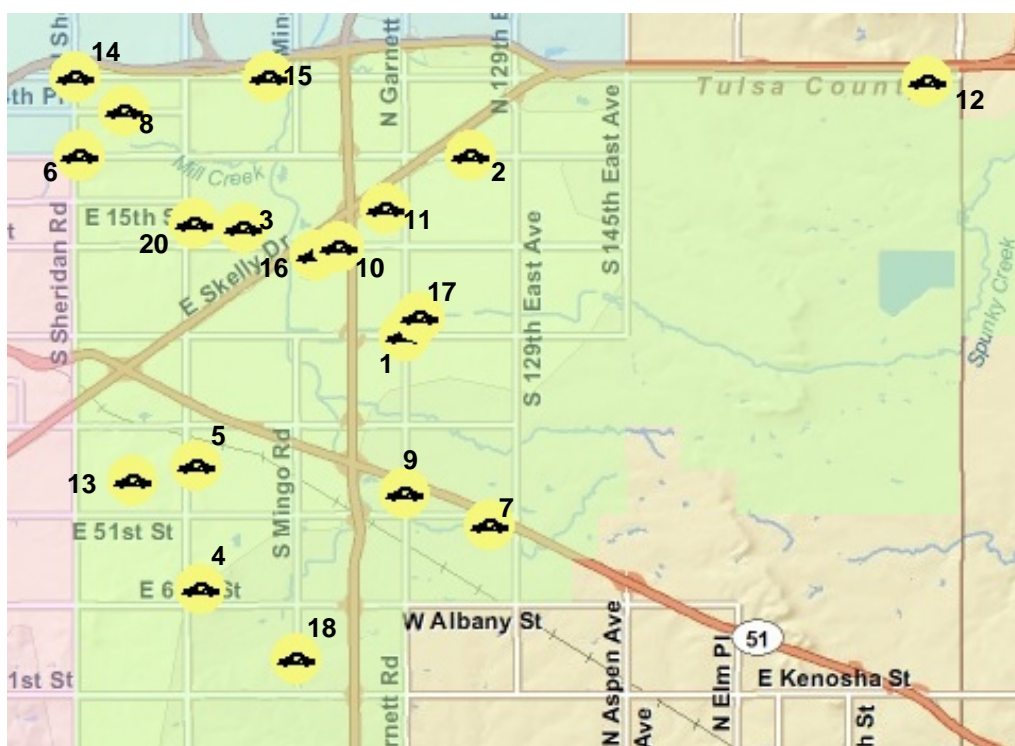
