CRIME AWARENESS INFORMATION

The following information relates to crimes that have occurred during the previous week. Below, you will see a brief description of each crime type and some explanatory notes. The icon that will be used on the map is given with the crime type description. The map is designed to give you enough information to see crimes occurring near you, but should not compromise any individual's privacy. Please understand that it would be too labor intensive to provide exact addresses, dates, or times for each individual crime. When I am able, I will provide you with suspect and vehicle information tied to particular crimes. If you do not see a map with your neighborhood for a crime type, then good for you! Your area was either not victimized or had minimal activity with little to no information that would assist you. Keep your eyes open and work hard to keep it that way!

I will also do my best to provide you information on arrests for various crimes so that you can take that information into account as you assess the safety of your homes and businesses. As these sometimes occur weeks afterward, we do not always know when they occur. For example, when a patrol officer arrests someone for a burglary warrant, the location or particulars of the crime are not detailed in the warrant. It would take time to research that case and find what crime the warrant was issued in relation to. The patrol officer does not need that information to book the arrestee in and does not have time to do the research.

The Citizen's Crime Commission is an organization that as a part of its mission assists citizens in organizing and sustaining Alert Neighbor and Citizen's Alert Patrol groups. This includes facilitating communication with law enforcement. If you need assistance with forming a new Alert Neighbor group or getting the most out of the one you belong to, or forming Citizen's Alert Patrol group, the Citizen's Crime Commission can assist you. If you would like an officer who patrols your area to attend a meeting, please make that request through Carol Bush with the Citizen's Crime Commission. HOMICIDE

I will plot this category and give you basic information on these crimes. They generally do not pertain to anything that would affect you as an individual. Most homicides in Tulsa have nothing to do with the honest citizens of Tulsa. Rest assured, if information points to a contributing factor in our control, such as the way in which a nightclub operates or chronic drug dealing at a location, I will inform you and deal with it. HOMICIDES



No homicides to report from last week. Out of the 20 homicides city wide year to date, we have only three homicides in the Mingo Valley area. RAPE

MVD averages about 5 rapes a month. We rarely have a stranger rape. Rapes generally involve domestic situations or acquaintance situations which generally do not present an opportunity for action. For this reason, and in order to protect the anonymity of victims, I will not routinely plot rapes. Rest assured that if a stranger rape occurs, I will notify you. 👤 ROBBERY

This category refers to theft of property from a person or business where force or fear is used. It can involve a weapon or no weapon. Home invasion robberies will be mapped. Nearly ALL home invasion robberies are tied to drug dealing, gambling, or certain knowledge of money in the home. Nearly ALWAYS, the suspects are known to the victim. If we experience a home invasion that does not fit this profile, I will notify you. Robbery Comments

- 1. 7/3 11:30 p.m. at 10900 E. 21st Street.** The store owner stated that three b/m's entered the Minute Mart and attempted to grab several items. The store owner grabbed the items from the suspects and was struck by the suspects and they fled the store. The suspects left in a gold 2001 Buick Regal bearing OK tag 556ACL. The suspects are described as 5'05"-5'10" tall, 110-160 pounds, and 19-21 years of age.
- 2. 7/3 00:20 a.m. at 12500 E. 21st Street.** The restaurant employee stated that he went out the back door to take out the trash. As soon as he was outside he was confronted by a h/m with a pistol. The suspect demanded his wallet and the victim reached for his wallet. When he did the suspect struck him with the pistol, cutting his left eye. The suspect took his wallet and wanted the victim to go back into the store with him to get more money. The victim told the suspect that they would have to go through the front door because the back door automatically locks. The suspect then hit the victim again and the victim began to fight back. The suspect then fled the scene on foot. The suspect is described as a light skinned h/m, 5'06"-5'07" tall, and 20-25 years of age. The victim stated that the suspect spoke to him in Spanish the entire time.
- 3. 7/1 12:30 p.m. at 9700 E. 31st Street.** The victim stated that she was in her residence when a b/m came inside through the unlocked front door. The suspect told the victim that he had a gun and that he wanted her money. When the victim told him that she didn't have any money, he demanded her bank card. The victim gave the suspect her food stamp Access card and told him there was an ATM across the street. The suspect left the residence and the victim called police. Officers arrived on the scene and the suspect was located a short distance away and arrested. The victim's property was still in his possession. The suspect was identified as Darren Mayberry.
- 4. 7/3 2:40 p.m. at 10100 E. 32nd Street.** The victim is in his residence with his younger sister when someone knocks on the door. When the victim opens the door five b/m's and a b/f push their way in and begin hitting the victim. The suspects accuse the victim of stealing a computer and search the residence. The suspects then take two cell phones and flee on foot. The suspects are described as two juveniles, a b/m and b/f, 4'06"-5'00" tall, 90 pounds, and approximately 9 years of age. The other three suspects are described as b/m's approximately 16-20 years of age.
- 5. 7/2 3:25 p.m. at 4600 S. 72nd E. Avenue.** The victim is in her residence when her son enters with two w/m's. The two w/m's then tell the victim they need her money, and then tell her they need her credit card to buy gas. The victim tells the two that she isn't giving them anything and they leave the residence. The victim walks outside to see where the two men went and see them standing by a black pickup. One of the suspects then pulls out a shotgun from the truck and the victim screams. The two males then leave the scene in the pickup. The suspects are described as two w/m's, 6'00" tall, with one weighing between 250-300 pounds. The other weighed between 180-190 pounds.
- 6. 6/27 12:10 p.m. at 7100 S. Sheridan Road.** The victim is shopping at the Wal-Mart at 6625 S. Memorial Drive when she is approached by a b/m and b/f. The victim ends up giving the two suspects a ride to the Bank of Oklahoma at 7121 S. Sheridan Road. The victim decides to check her balance while she is there and with the suspects in the vehicle. The b/m tells her to withdraw all of her money and she tells him no. He then produces a pistol and the victim complies. The suspects then have her drive to the area of 8100 S. Yale Avenue where they exit the vehicle. The victim returns to the Wal-Mart and calls police.

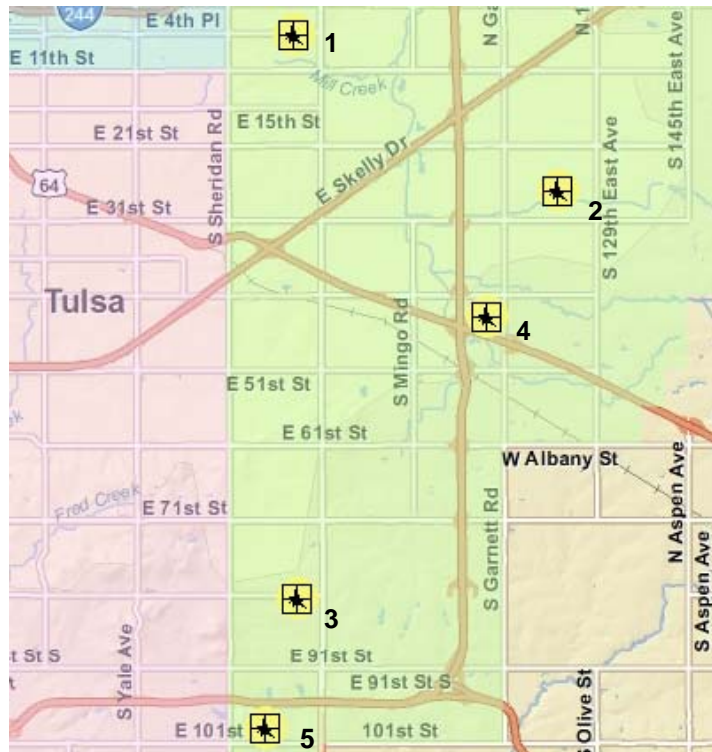
The b/m suspect is described as 5'11-6'00" tall, 160-170 pounds, with salt and pepper hair. The b/f suspect is described as 5'03"-5'00" tall, 160-175 pounds.

7. **6/27 9:30 a.m. at 10032 S. Mingo Road.** The victim is at the Kum and Go putting gas in her vehicle when she is approached by b/m. The b/m then asks the victim for change to buy gas and she tells him she doesn't have any. The suspect then tells her to give him everything she has or she will get shot, and shows her a silver pistol in his waistband. The victim complies and the suspect gets into a vehicle occupied by four other b/m's. The suspects leave the scene but the victim is able to get the tag number and calls police. The vehicle is stopped by police on E. 91st Street and the five suspects are arrested. The victim's property was found in the vehicle.

BURGLARY

This category will include breaking and entering homes, businesses, garages, or sheds for the purpose of committing a crime. It does not apply to any sort of trespassing. Although technically classified as larcenies by the FBI, for the sake of simplicity I will include burglaries from vehicles (BFVs) in this category. Residential burglaries predominantly happen during the day when no one is home. 1st degree burglaries, which are burglaries that occur when someone is home, are primarily related to domestics or happen when a burglar makes a mistake. Intentional 1st degree burglaries for the purpose of theft are extremely rare. I will advise you if we identify incidents of that nature. 2. 12200 E. 28th Street – 06302011 between 0420hrs and 0426hrs- Suspect entered through kitchen window while victim was sleeping and fled before police arrived.
3. 8400 S. 77th EA- between 07032011- 1800hrs and 0030hrs– Unknown point of entry. Suspect(s) removed cash and electronics from inside the apartment.

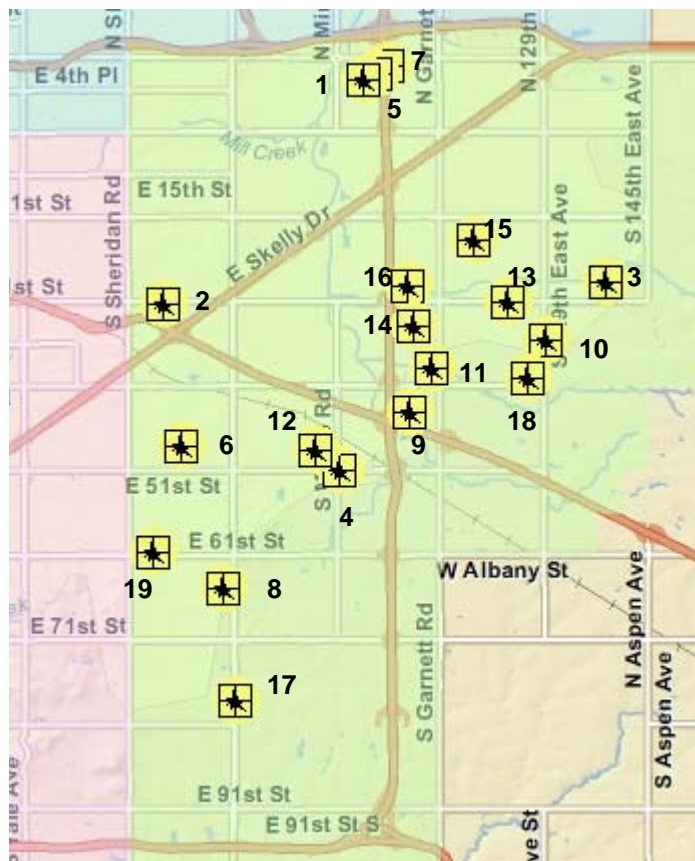
