CRIME AWARENESS INFORMATION

The following information relates to crimes that have occurred during the previous week. Below, you will see a brief description of each crime type and some explanatory notes. The icon that will be used on the map is given with the crime type description. The map is designed to give you enough information to see crimes occurring near you, but should not compromise any individual's privacy. Please understand that it would be too labor intensive to provide exact addresses, dates, or times for each individual crime. When I am able, I will provide you with suspect and vehicle information tied to particular crimes. If you do not see a map with your neighborhood for a crime type, then good for you! Your area was either not victimized or had minimal activity with little to no information that would assist you. Keep your eyes open and work hard to keep it that way!

I will also do my best to provide you information on arrests for various crimes so that you can take that information into account as you assess the safety of your homes and businesses. As these sometimes occur weeks afterward, we do not always know when they occur. For example, when a patrol officer arrests someone for a burglary warrant, the location or particulars of the crime are not detailed in the warrant. It would take time to research that case and find what crime the warrant was issued in relation to. The patrol officer does not need that information to book the arrestee in and does not have time to do the research.

The Citizen's Crime Commission is an organization that as a part of its mission assists citizens in organizing and sustaining Alert Neighbor and Citizen's Alert Patrol groups. This includes facilitating communication with law enforcement. If you need assistance with forming a new Alert Neighbor group or getting the most out of the one you belong to, or forming Citizen's Alert Patrol group, the Citizen's Crime Commission can assist you. If you would like an officer who patrols your area to attend a meeting, please make that request through Carol Bush with the Citizen's Crime Commission. HOMICIDE

I will plot this category and give you basic information on these crimes. They generally do not pertain to anything that would affect you as an individual. Most homicides in Tulsa have nothing to do with the honest citizens of Tulsa. Rest assured, if information points to a contributing factor in our control, such as the way in which a nightclub operates or chronic drug dealing at a location, I will inform you and deal with it. HOMICIDES



No homicides to report from last week. Out of the 31 homicides city wide year to date, we have only three homicides in the Mingo Valley area. The only open homicide in our area from this year is the narcotics related shooting death of Miguel Morales-Perez at 2124 S. Garnett Rd. on 020911. R RAPE

MVD averages about 5 rapes a month. We rarely have a stranger rape. Rapes generally involve domestic situations or acquaintance situations which generally do not present an opportunity for action. For this reason, and in order to protect the anonymity of victims, I will not routinely plot rapes. Rest assured that if a stranger rape occurs, I will notify you. - 1. 7/29 between 4:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. at 13000 E. 16th Street.** Suspects were known to victim.
- 2. 7/30 between 10:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. at 1700 S. 79th E. Avenue.** Suspect in this incident was an associate of the victim's friend. The suspect was taken into custody.
- 3. 7/30 between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. at 10100 E. 11th Street.** A rape was not reported for this incident however a report was taken for documentation purposes.

👤 ROBBERY

This category refers to theft of property from a person or business where force or fear is used. It can involve a weapon or no weapon. Home invasion robberies will be mapped. Nearly ALL home invasion robberies are tied to drug dealing, gambling, or certain knowledge of money in the home. Nearly ALWAYS, the suspects are known to the victim. If we experience a home invasion that does not fit this profile, I will notify you. Robbery Comments

- 1. 7/26 4:30 a.m. at 400 S. 130th E. Avenue.** A black male suspect made entry through an unlocked side door. Suspect was armed with a handgun and fled on foot after a brief struggle with the victim.
- 2. 7/29 11:45 p.m. at 3700 S. 131st E. Avenue.** Two black male suspects, armed with handguns, broke in through a back door then placed the victims in a bedroom while they removed electronic equipment from throughout the residence.
- 3. 7/30 between 3:30 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. at 3200 S. 79th E. Avenue.** The victim was robbed at gun point by two black males at a local motel. The incident is possibly drug related and the suspects have been identified. The loss was reported to be cash. An arrest has been made in connection to the incident.
- 4. 7/25 10:30 p.m. at 1700 S. Memorial Drive.** The victim was robbed at gunpoint by two black male suspects while he was attempting to purchase a cell phone. Loss was cash.
- 5. 7/28 between 8:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. at 10100 S. Memorial Drive.** Victim gave conflicting information about a possible white male suspect armed with a gun that allegedly stole cash and medication from her in a business lot.
- 6. 7/31 1:00 a.m. at 10700 E. 41st Street.** Victim stated that a black male took his cell phone at gunpoint while he was walking in an apartment complex parking lot.
- 7. 7/26 11:00 a.m. at 10100 E. 11th Street.** Victim was robbed at gun point by a white male suspect while staying at a local motel. Suspect has been identified and at least one arrest has been made in connection to the incident.
- 8. 7/31 9:40 p.m. at 6500 E. 21st Street.** Two black male suspects robbed the business at gunpoint and left in an unknown direction of travel.
- 9. 7/26 between 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. at 4800 S. 74th E. Avenue.** The victim was delivering pizzas when he was robbed at gunpoint by several suspects all which have been taken into custody.
- 10. 7/25 2:00 p.m. at 1100 S. Garnett.** Suspect waited for the victim to fill his prescription at a pharmacy then took it from him as he ran out of the store. The white male suspect was seen leaving in a maroon Ford truck.
- 11. 7/28 10:00 p.m. at 6300 S. 69th E. Place.** While standing outside of his residence the victim was approached by a black male suspect asking to use the phone. That suspect along with three other black males then assaulted the victim and removed all property from his person.
- 12. 7/29 8:30 a.m. at 11300 E. 31st Street.** The victim had her purse forcibly removed by two black male suspects as she was walking through a parking lot.

BURGLARY

This category will include breaking and entering homes, businesses, garages, or sheds for the purpose of committing a crime. It does not apply to any sort of trespassing. Although technically classified as larcenies by the FBI, for the sake of simplicity I will include burglaries from vehicles (BFVs) in this category. Residential burglaries predominantly happen during the day when no one is home. 1st degree burglaries, which are burglaries that occur when someone is home, are primarily related to domestics or happen when a burglar makes a mistake. Intentional 1st degree burglaries for the purpose of theft are extremely rare. I will advise you if we identify incidents of that nature. 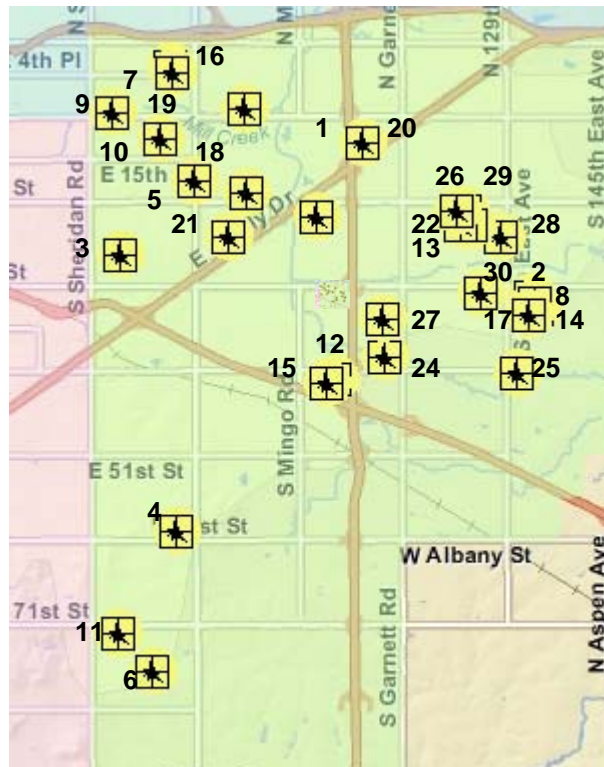

Nighttime Residential Burglary Comments

1. **Between 7/26 11:00 p.m. and 7/27 12:15 a.m. 4800 S. 73rd E. Avenue.** The suspect was known to the victim and made entry by forcing the front door open. Suspect was taken into custody a short time later.
2. **7/26 1:30 a.m. at 12200 E. 13th Place.** Suspect is known to victim and the situation will be related to a domestic disturbance.
3. **7/28 between 7:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. at 18500 E. 3rd Street.** Possible white male suspect made entry by forcing the front door open. Only item reported missing was one piece of jewelry.
4. **7/31 4:30 a.m. at 7400 E. 1st Street.** This situation is domestic related and the suspect is known to the victim.
5. **7/29 7:30 p.m. at 6500 E. 21st Place.** Several Hispanic male suspects were seen entering the victim's apartment through a sliding door. A gaming system was removed and was later recovered.

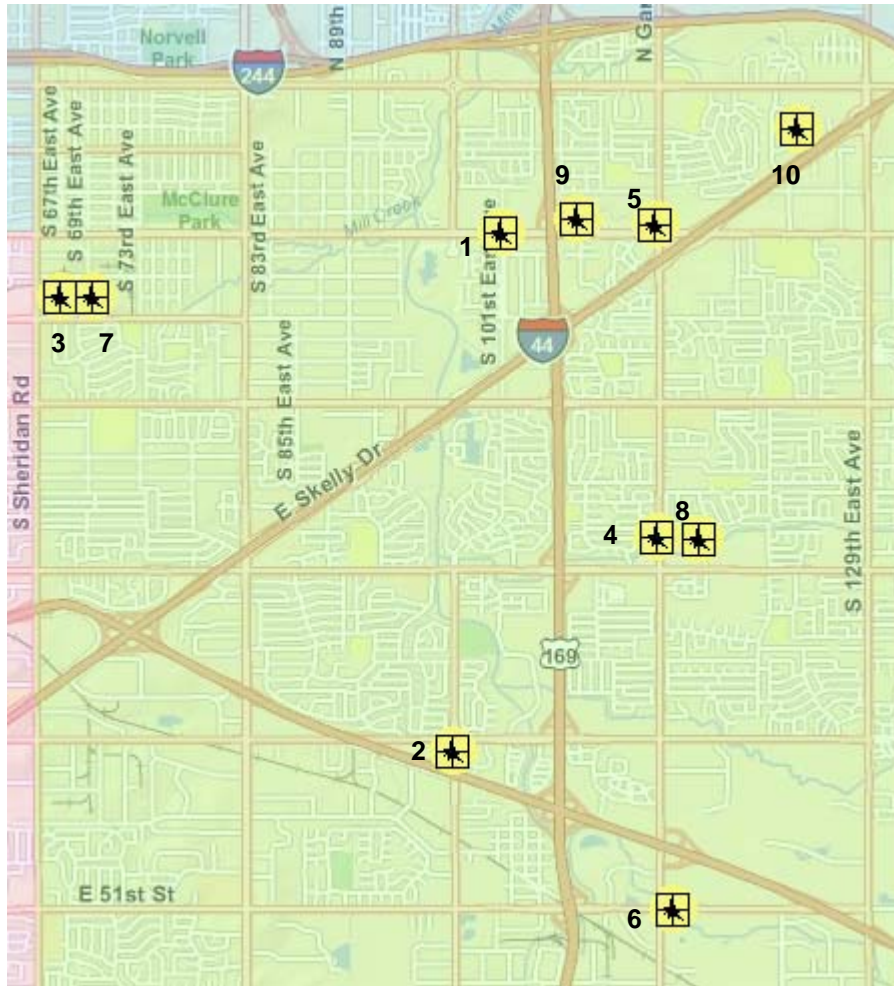

- 1. 7/25 11:00 a.m. at 2100 S. 99th E. Avenue.** Front door was forced open and electronics were removed by unknown suspects.
- 2. 7/25 between 13:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. at 13200 E. 32nd Street.** Unknown suspect forced the front door open and removed electronics, jewelry, cash and medication.
- 3. 7/25 between 11:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. at 6700 E. 27th Street.** Suspect used an unknown tool to pry open the front door and then removed electronics.
- 4. 7/25 between 7:00 a.m. and 2:50 p.m. at 7900 E. 59th Street.** Unknown suspect forced the front door open and removed electronic items while the victim was at school.
- 5. 7/25 between 6:15 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. at 1900 S. 89th E. Avenue.** Suspect kicked front door while victim was at work. Electronic items were removed.
- 6. 7/26 1500 hours at 7400 E. 77th Street.** 3 black males suspects forced the front door open and removed a flatscreen TV. Suspects were seen leaving in a black truck.
- 7. 7/26 1:00 p.m at 400 S. 78th E. Avenue.** A black male suspect forced the front door open then fled the scene in a black vehicle after being confronted.
- 8. 7/26 between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. at 13300 E. 32nd Street.** Front door was kicked open and various items were removed. Possible suspect is known to the victim.
- 9. 7/26 between 8:00 a.m. and 13:30 p.m. at 6700 E. 10th Street.** Unknown suspect forced the front door open. No loss was reported at time of incident.
- 10. 7/27 between 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. at 900 S. 89th E. Avenue.** Suspects forced the front door open and removed gaming equipment from a child's room.
- 11. 7/27 between 12:00 pm and 5:00 p.m. at 6900 E. 72nd Street.** Suspects forced open the front door then removed electronic items and cash.
- 12. 7/28 between 6:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. at 10100 E. 42nd Place.** Suspect made entry by forcing the front door open. The only missing item at time of report was a laptop computer.
- 13. 7/28 9:15 a.m. at 2400 S. 123rd E. Avenue.** Three black male suspects forced the front door open and removed electronic items from inside the residence. They were seen leaving in a black Dodge Neon vehicle.
- 14. 7/29 3:30 p.m. at 3400 S. 132nd E. Avenue.** Three Hispanic male suspects forced the front door open and began to ransack the house. The burglary was thwarted by an alert neighbor and at least one suspect was in custody at time of report.
- 15. 7/31 between 6:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. at 4100 S. 103rd E. Avenue.** Unknown suspects made entry through a side window. Various items were removed.
- 16. 7/26 between 10:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. at 400 S. 78th E. Avenue.** An unknown suspect attempted to make entry through a back door however the attempt was unsuccessful.

- 17. 7/29 7:00 a.m. at 3100 S. 132nd E. Avenue.** A black male suspect kicked the front door open then ran once he was discovered by the homeowner.
- 18. 7/30 4:00 p.m. at 1700 S. Memorial Drive.** Unknown suspect attempted to make entry by breaking a window and kicking the front door. The entire attempt was unsuccessful.
- 19. 7/30 5:00 p.m. at 1300 S. 76th E. Avenue.** Victim found that several window to the residence had been damaged but no entry had been made.
- 20. 7/31 11:00 a.m. at 1300 S. 107th E. Avenue.** A black male a black female suspect attempted to make entry through the victim's front door but ran away when discovered.
- 21. 7/25 between 11:00 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. at 8500 E. 24th Street.** Unknown suspects made entry through a side window. It appeared that the motive was vandalism.
- 22. Between 7/25 and 7/26 at 12100 E. 24th Street.** Suspects were renters and the incident will be related to a civil matter.
- 23. 7/27 between 10:30 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. at 200 N. 125th E. Avenue(not mapped).** The unknown suspect kicked the front door but appeared to have been scared off by the alarm system.
- 24. 7/27 between 3:00 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. at 10900 E. 39th Street.** The suspect pried the front door open with an unknown tool and removed a gaming system.
- 25. Between 7/28 and 7/29 at 4100 S. 130th E. Avenue.** Again the suspect used an unknown tool to pry the front door open. A TV was removed during this incident.
- 26. 7/28 between 1:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. at 11900 E. 21st Court.** While the victim was asleep, an unknown suspect used a tool to open the rear sliding door and remove a gaming console from the living area.

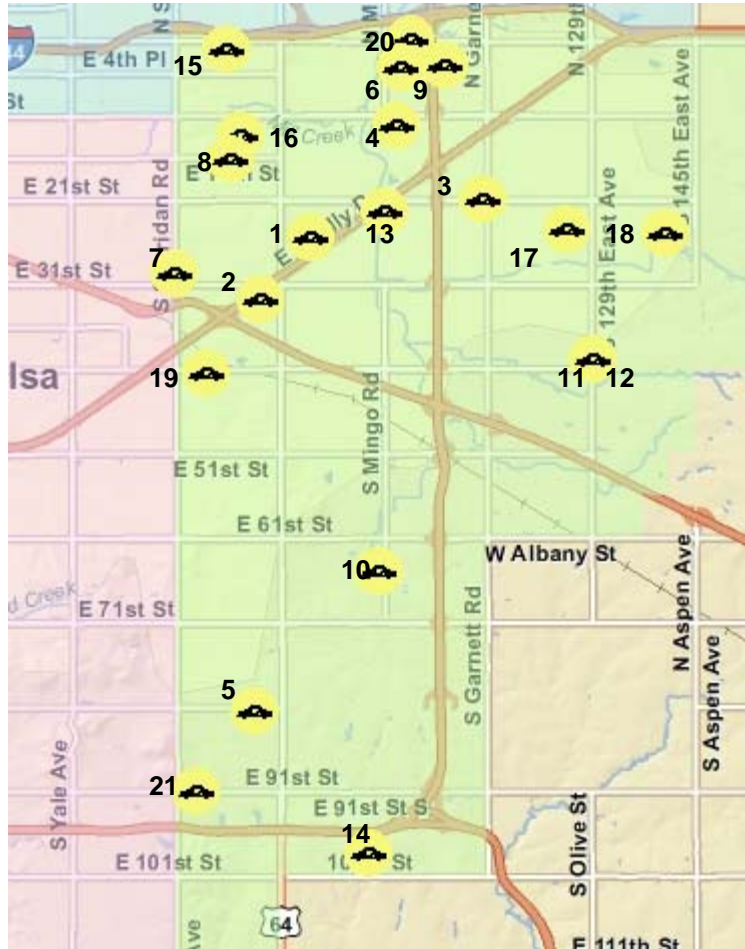
- 1. 7/26 3:30 a.m. at 10100 E. 11th Street.** Unknown suspect used a knife to pry open the office door to the business and removed cash.

- 4. Between 7/30 and 7/31 at 2800 S. Garnett Road.** Suspect broke side window and the motive may have been vandalism. No loss reported.
- 5. 7/31 1:00 p.m. at 1000 S. Garnett Road.** Cash was taken from a locked area of the business. Will be employee related.

6. **7/26 2:00 a.m. at 11400 E. 51st Street.** Suspect used a cinder block to enter the business. No loss reported.
