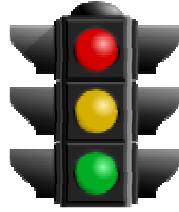

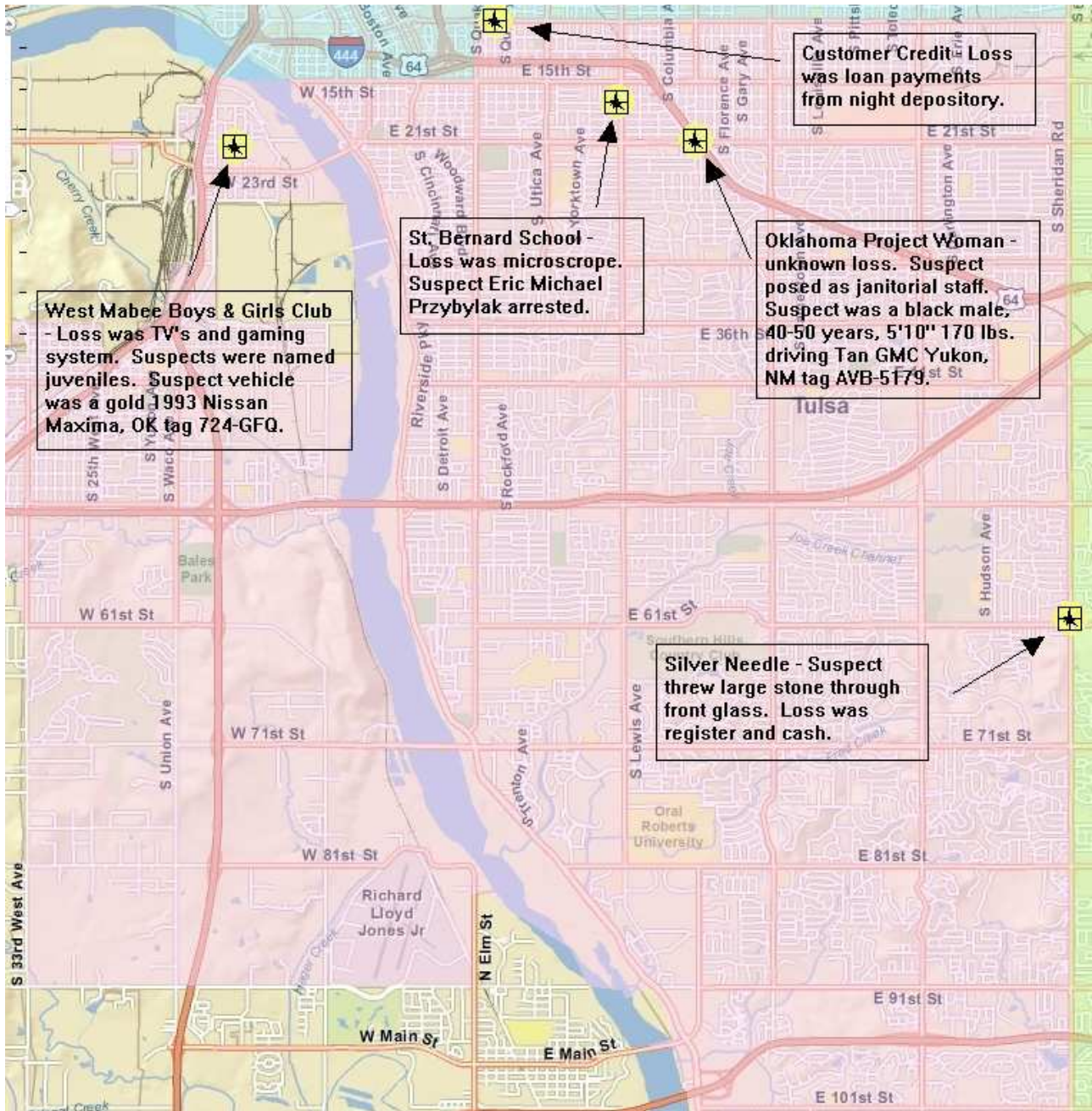
**REMEMBER
SCHOOL BUS
SAFETY**

A motorist is required to stop upon approach, passing, or overtaking a school on which the red loading signals are in operation. Violation of this City of Tulsa Ordinance can result in a \$500 fine.

With the start of the new school year, Tulsa Police will focus on speeding in school zones. The speed limit is 25 mph in school zones. If cited for speeding in a school zone, the violator will be required to appear before a municipal judge.

The Tulsa Public Schools Police Department also has jurisdiction to enforce traffic violations adjacent to schools.

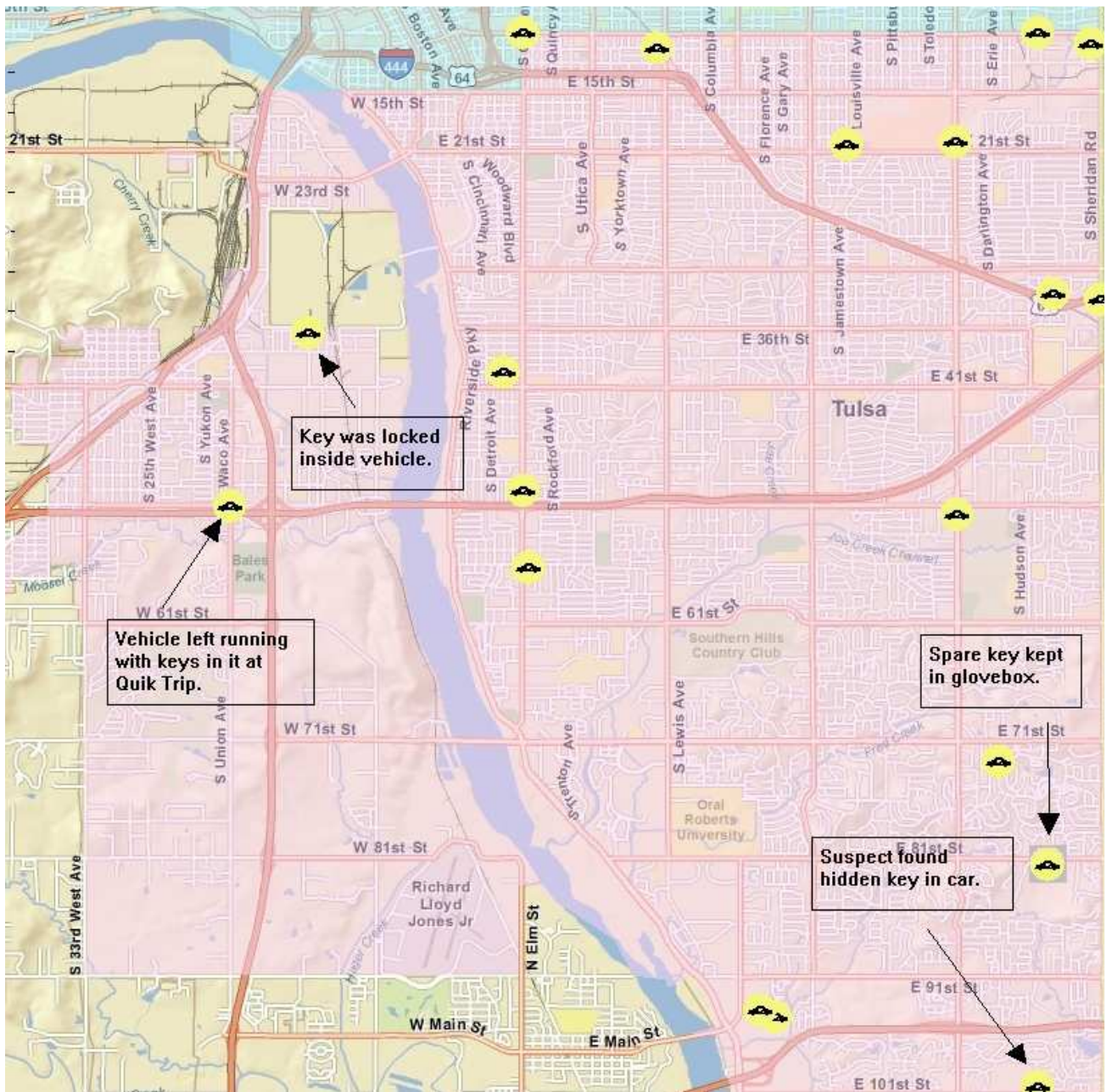

Preventing Identity Theft

Do not give out personal information. Credit card numbers, social security numbers and other identifying numbers are already on file with the financial institutions where you do business. Legitimate business will not call you and ask for that information. Remember, if someone has a right to this information about you, they should already have it!

Report lost or stolen checks to your bank. The numbers contained on your checks can give clear access to a thief. Always properly store cancelled checks, and examine new checks to be sure none were stolen in shipment. Make sure you store checks in a safe and secure location.

Destroy unused financial solicitations. Tear up or shred unwanted junk mail since it may contain information that a thief could use to steal your identity. Remember to safely destroy any types of financial statements or receipts since they also contain sensitive information.

Guard your Automated Teller Machine Card and PIN Number. While these types of cards can make life easier for you they can completely disrupt your life if they fall into the hands of a thief. Always guard your card and PIN. Never leave receipts lying around. Never allow someone to stand behind you at a teller machine.

Make sure your mailbox is secure. Promptly remove mail when it has been delivered. Consider using a lockable mailbox. Thieves often raid mailboxes to obtain credit card information or financial statements.

Switch to paperless billing. Many companies allow you to receive bill notifications by email, eliminating the risk of account information being sent by mail.

Contact the major credit reporting companies. These companies can tell you who or what company has accessed your credit report. The three major companies are; Equifax 1-800-685-1111, Experian 1-888-397-3742, TransUnion 1-800-916-8800.

Boating Under the Influence

Earlier this year, the governor signed legislation into law making it illegal in Oklahoma to operate a boat while under the influence. The prohibitions and penalties are similar to DUI statutes.

The new statute states in part...

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or be in actual physical control of a vessel upon the waters of this state, except privately owned waters, who:

1. Has a blood or breath alcohol concentration of eight-hundredths (0.08) or more at the time of a test of the person's blood or breath;
2. Is under the influence of any other intoxicating substance to a degree which renders such person incapable of safely operating a vessel upon the waters of this state; or
3. Is under the influence of alcohol and any other intoxicating substance to a degree which renders such person incapable of safely operating a vessel upon the waters of this state.
