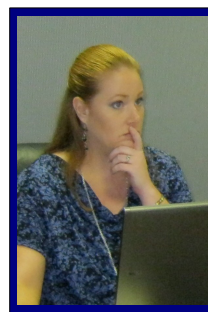

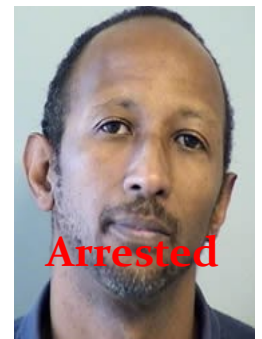

Hard Hitting Detective Work!

On August 15th, Steven Deloney was arrested for the O.C.C.U Bank Robberies that took place earlier this month. Detective Max Ryden found suspect Deloney arriving at the Bristol Park Apartments in the same-type car as was seen being used by the suspect as the getaway vehicle. Detective Ryden pursued and caught the suspect while Officers C. Tapper and T. Means quickly assisted in the apprehension.

Fugitive Warrant Detectives and the U.S. Marshal became involved in a pursuit of a man believed to be a wanted fugitive on August 22nd, 2130 hours. Thirty-seven-year-old suspect, Darren Williams disappeared in a wooded region in the area of Independence and Utica. The helicopter attempted to isolate the suspect, then K-9 officers were called in to assist. Hot on his tail, he attempted to get away via bicycle, which resulted in his capture and arrest by field officers.
