## **CRIME AWARENESS INFORMATION**

The following information relates to crimes that have occurred during the previous week. Below, you will see a brief description of each crime type and some explanatory notes. The icon that will be used on the map is given with the crime type description. The map is designed to give you enough information to see crimes occurring near you, but should not compromise any individual's privacy. Please understand that it would be too labor intensive to provide exact addresses, dates, or times for each individual crime. When I am able, I will provide you with suspect and vehicle information tied to particular crimes. If you do not see a map with your neighborhood for a crime type, then good for you! Your area was either not victimized or had minimal activity with little to no information that would assist you. Keep your eyes open and work hard to keep it that way!

I will also do my best to provide you information on arrests for various crimes so that you can take that information into account as you assess the safety of your homes and businesses. As these sometimes occur weeks afterward, we do not always know when they occur. For example, when a patrol officer arrests someone for a burglary warrant, the location or particulars of the crime are not detailed in the warrant. It would take time to research that case and find what crime the warrant was issued in relation to. The patrol officer does not need that information to book the arrestee in and does not have time to do the research.

The Citizen's Crime Commission is an organization that as a part of its mission assists citizens in organizing and sustaining Alert Neighbor and Citizen's Alert Patrol groups. This includes facilitating communication with law enforcement. If you need assistance with forming a new Alert Neighbor group or getting the most out of the one you belong to, or forming Citizen's Alert Patrol group, the Citizen's Crime Commission can assist you. 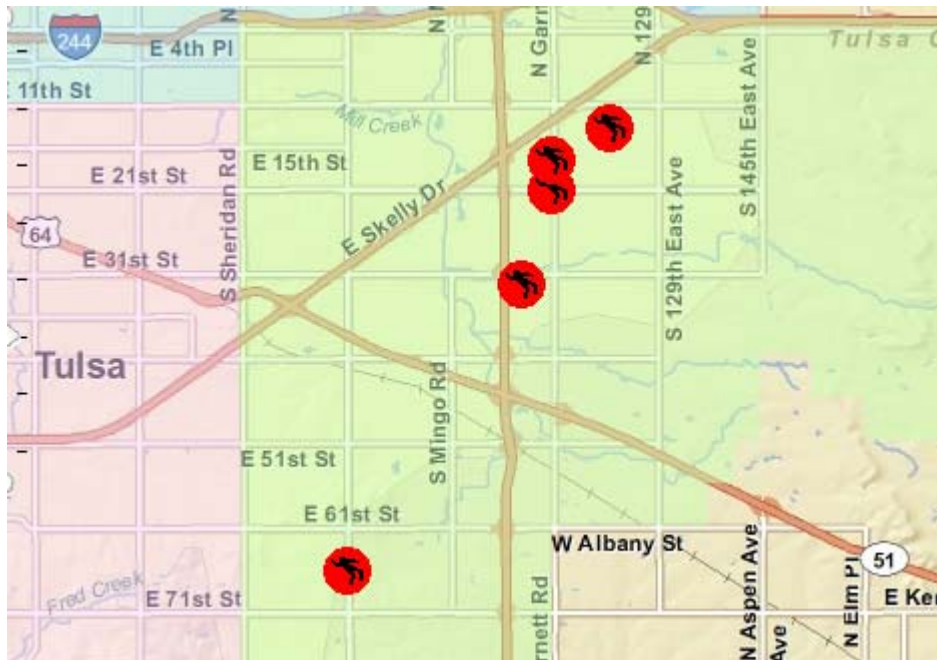

## HOMICIDE

I will plot this category and give you basic information on these crimes. They generally do not pertain to anything that would affect you as an individual. Most homicides in Tulsa have nothing to do with the honest citizens of Tulsa. Rest assured, if information points to a contributing factor in our control, such as the way in which a nightclub operates or chronic drug dealing at a location, I will inform you and deal with it. 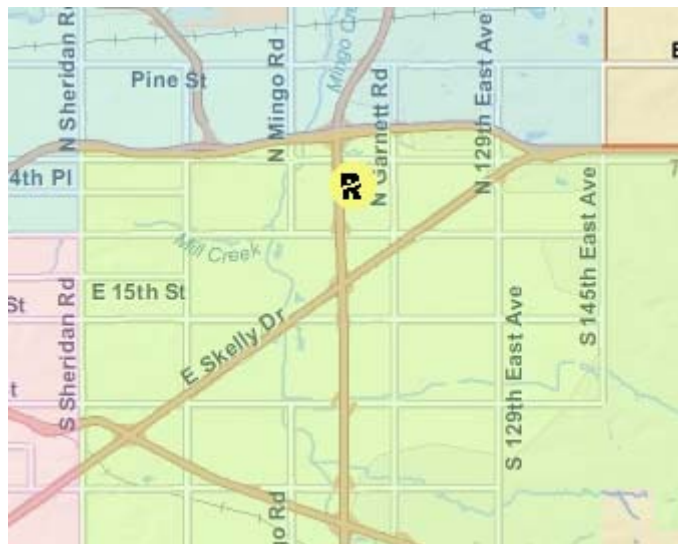
### HOMICIDES



Out of the 31 homicides city wide year to date, we have only five homicides in the Mingo Valley area. The only open homicide in our area from this year is the narcotics related shooting death of Miguel Morales-Perez at 2124 S. Garnett Rd. on 020911. There have been two additional homicides since the last crime bulletin was published and arrests have been made in both incidents. ## **R** RAPE

MVD averages about 5 rapes a month. We rarely have a stranger rape. Rapes generally involve domestic situations or acquaintance situations which generally do not present an opportunity for action. For this reason, and in order to protect the anonymity of victims, I will not routinely plot rapes. Rest assured that if a stranger rape occurs, I will notify you. ## ROBBERY

This category refers to theft of property from a person or business where force or fear is used. It can involve a weapon or no weapon. Home invasion robberies will be mapped. Nearly ALL home invasion robberies are tied to drug dealing, gambling, or certain knowledge of money in the home. Nearly ALWAYS, the suspects are known to the victim. If we experience a home invasion that does not fit this profile, I will notify you. - 1. 8/19 9:00 pm at 1200 S. 107<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** A black male and Native American male took the victim's vehicle at gunpoint. Vehicle has been recovered and an arrest has been made in relation to the incident.
- 2. 8/17 12:30 p.m. at 5000 S. Memorial Drive.** Black male suspect removed cash from the business at gunpoint and left the scene on foot.
- 3. 8/21 1:00 a.m. at 4100 S. 130<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** Suspects were known to the victim and have been arrested.
- 4. 8/21 6:00 p.m. at 7300 S. 99<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** Black male suspect and a Hispanic male suspect took victims money, at gunpoint, while standing in an apartment parking lot.
- 5. 8/16 10:00 p.m. at 1500 S. 79<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** Victim was robbed at gunpoint while going to an apartment. Suspect description was unknown at time of report.
- 6. 8/18 1:00 p.m. at 4100 S. 100<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** While at work the victim was assaulted and a cell phone was taken. Suspect is known to the victim.

## BURGLARY

This category will include breaking and entering homes, businesses, garages, or sheds for the purpose of committing a crime. It does not apply to any sort of trespassing. Although technically classified as larcenies by the FBI, for the sake of simplicity I will include burglaries from vehicles (BFVs) in this category. Residential burglaries predominantly happen during the day when no one is home. 1<sup>st</sup> degree burglaries, which are burglaries that occur when someone is home, are primarily related to domestics or happen when a burglar makes a mistake. Intentional 1<sup>st</sup> degree burglaries for the purpose of theft are extremely rare. I will advise you if we identify incidents of that nature. ## Nighttime Residential Burglary Comments

1. **Between 8/15 and 8/16 at 10900 E. 39<sup>th</sup> Place.** Suspects made entry through a damaged door while the victim was at school. Small items were removed and suspects have since been arrested.
2. **8/19 at 2800 S. 116<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** Unknown suspect forced front door open and removed electronics while victim was out of town.
3. **8/19 at 2500 S. 91<sup>st</sup> E. Avenue.** This incident is related to a domestic situation in which the suspect is known to the victim.
4. **8/20 at 7300 E. 49<sup>th</sup> Place.** This incident is also related to a domestic situation in which the suspect is known to the victim.
5. **8/18 at 8200 S. 77<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** Unknown suspect and method of entry. Electronics were taken.
6. **8/19 at 11300 E. 23<sup>rd</sup> Street.** Unknown suspect made entry through an unlocked window and removed a TV while the victim was sleeping.

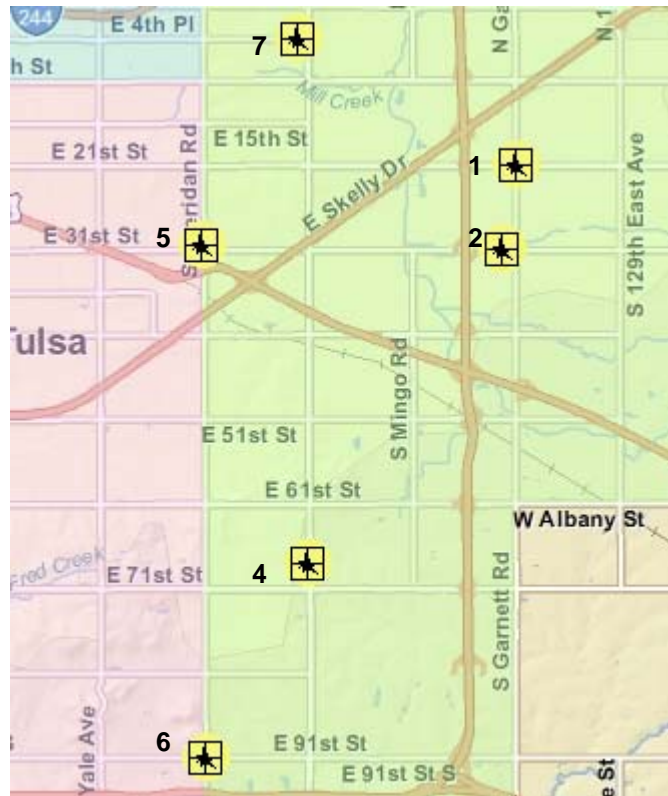
## DAYTIME RESIDENTIAL/UNKNOWN TIME BURGLARIES



1. **8/17 at 9100 E. 26<sup>th</sup> Street.** Unknown suspect forced entry through a window and removed electronics.
2. **8/18 at 2800 S. 116<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue.** Unknown suspect forced entry through a door and removed a TV.

3. 8/19 at 8300 E. 60<sup>th</sup> Street (not mapped). Unknown suspect forced entry through a door and removed electronics.
4. 8/19 at 11300 E. 23<sup>rd</sup> Street. Unknown suspect forced entry through a door and removed electronics and jewelry.
5. 8/19 at 8300 E. 60<sup>th</sup> Street. Unknown suspect forced entry through a door and removed electronics. Will be related to #3.

7. 8/20 at 1600 S. 125<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue. Unknown suspect forced the front door open. Only jewelry was taken.
8. Between 8/15 and 8/17 at 12000 E. 33<sup>rd</sup> Place. Unknown suspect forced entry
9. Between 8/17 and 8/18 at 11200 E. Archer Place. Black male suspect forced entry through a door and removed a electronics.
10. Between 8/17 and 8/18 at 2800 S. 116<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue. Unknown suspect made entry through a rear door then removed cash and firearms.
11. Between 8/19 and 8/21 at 11900 E. 21<sup>st</sup> Place (not mapped). Unknown suspect made entry through a rear door then removed luggage and a TV.

## COMMERCIAL BURGLARIES

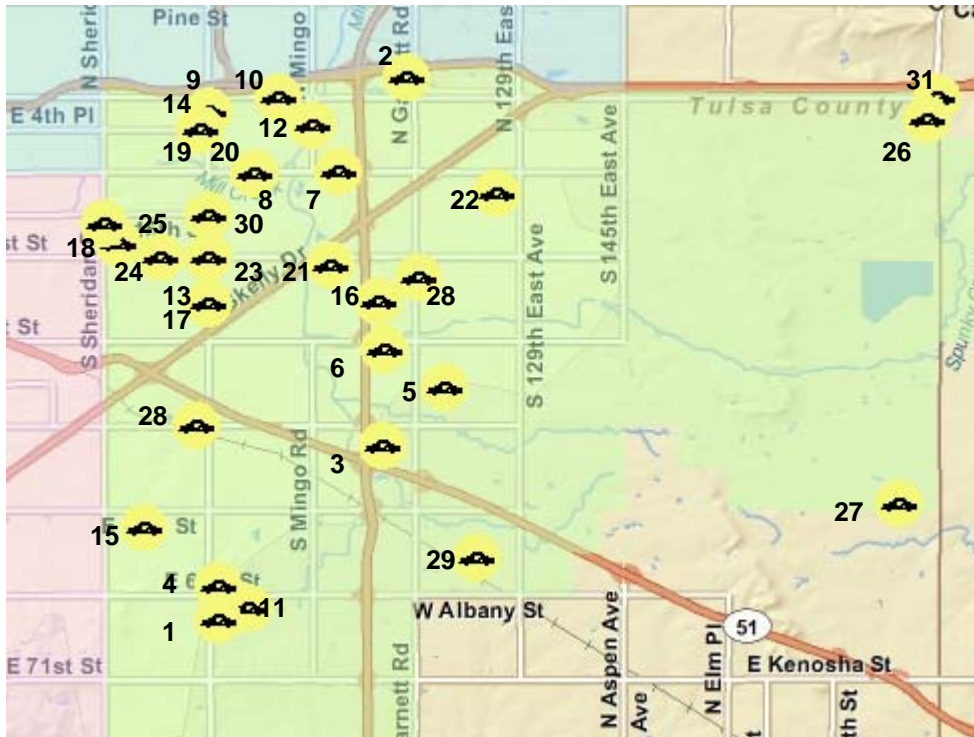


### Commercial Burglary Comments

- 1. 8/15 at 11300 E. 21<sup>st</sup> Street.** Three black male suspects used a truck to drive through a store window and removed electronics.
- 2. 8/17 at 11100 E. 31<sup>st</sup> Street.** Two black male juveniles and one white juvenile vandalized a store cooler in order to remove property.
- 3. Between 8/20 and 8/21 at 8100 E. 68<sup>th</sup> Street (not mapped).** Unknown suspect pried the business door open and attempted to remove cash. No loss was reported.
- 4. 8/21 at 6800 S. Memorial.** Same as above incident however a small amount of cash was removed.
- 5. 8/15 at 3000 S. Sheridan Road.** Unknown suspect attempted to use a vehicle in order to gain entry into the business. Will be related to several other incidents.
- 6. Between 8/17 and 8/18 at 6500 E. 91<sup>st</sup> Street.** Unknown suspect gained entry into the business through the front glass. A small amount of cash was taken.

## AUTO THEFT

This category includes the larceny of vehicles and heavy equipment such as bulldozers. The icon will also show up on crime maps when a vehicle stolen from outside of Tulsa is recovered in Tulsa (since no original crime report was generated here in the city).
