What do you do for the Financial Crimes Unit? We investigate all financial crimes from embezzlement to uttering forged instruments.

What is your proudest moment as a Detective? An elderly lady (88yoa) from OKC was scammed by some travelers. The travelers came to Tulsa after stealing credit cards from the elderly victim in OKC. To shorten the story; I caught the criminal in Tulsa prior to him ruining the victims credit. The victim came to Tulsa to testify that the suspect was the man who entered her house using a ruse, and I testified the same suspect was in possession of her cards upon arrest. (Proud Part) As the suspect was convicted and escorted from the courtroom, she walked up to him and said, "You should be ashamed of yourself!" At that moment I was extremely proud of that woman's courage. Moments later she bolstered my pride by seeking me out, introducing herself, and asked if she could hug me. As she hugged me she said, "Thank you, young man, for being who you are and catching that bad man". Yep...I was proud!

What has been your most unusual case? I had a case where a bookkeeper embezzled over 2.6 MILLION dollars from her employer over a 4-year period. The interesting question is: How much money do you have to make before you take notice of 2.6 million dollars missing over a four year period??? Do the math...that is approx. \$650,000.00 a year!

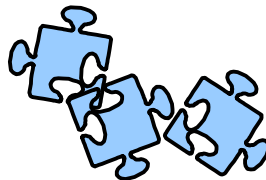

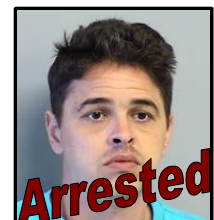

Elderly Fraud

Lance Boswell, 26, was arrested and taken into custody without incident at the F&M Bank on 17th & Sheridan Tuesday by Field Officers. Sgt. Neece and Officer's Robertson, Burgess, and Ash did a great job of investigating the incident thoroughly when the bank called authorities about their suspicions. Boswell was attempting to cash a check for \$1500 from a senior citizen who he says he did work for.

Thanks to Senior Services Detectives, Cpl. Whittington and Det. Compton for working to identify these people. Detectives say Lance Boswell and his cousin Dusty Joles were operating in the Tulsa area, approaching elderly peoples' homes and persuading them to pay for repairs that were needed on their homes. Lance Boswell had a Felony Warrant out of Oklahoma City for Home Repair Fraud.
