Court records for many Oklahoma counties are available online. You can review court cases, including criminal, civil, domestic, and traffic. The two major websites are Oklahoma State Court Network www.oscn.net and On

Oct 7th – At about 4:30 pm, officers responded to a shooting on the parking lot of Walgreens, 51st and Lewis. Investigation revealed that a Hispanic male followed the victim to the Walgreens, and shot the victim in the head with a shotgun as he got out of his van. Witnesses provided a vehicle description to officers.

The following evening, Officers Dean Montgomery and Chase Calhoun were searching for the suspect vehicle, when they found a truck matching the description near 58th and Utica. As they approached the truck, they saw a shotgun in the back seat. The driver told Officer Calhoun he shot the victim at Walgreens.

Officers arrested juvenile Erick Villalobos for Shooting with Intent to Kill and other weapons charges.

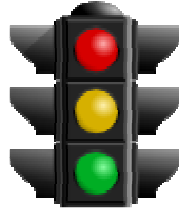

The Traffic Signal

Information from the
Riverside Traffic Unit

The driver of a vehicle **shall completely stop** his vehicle before entering any intersection where official stop signs have been erected.

Vehicle stops at stop signs shall be made with the vehicle **ceasing all forward movement**, in the proper lane, **behind the extending curb line** of the intersecting street, and in a position where the driver has **complete visibility to the right and left of the intersection**.

The preset municipal fine is \$150.



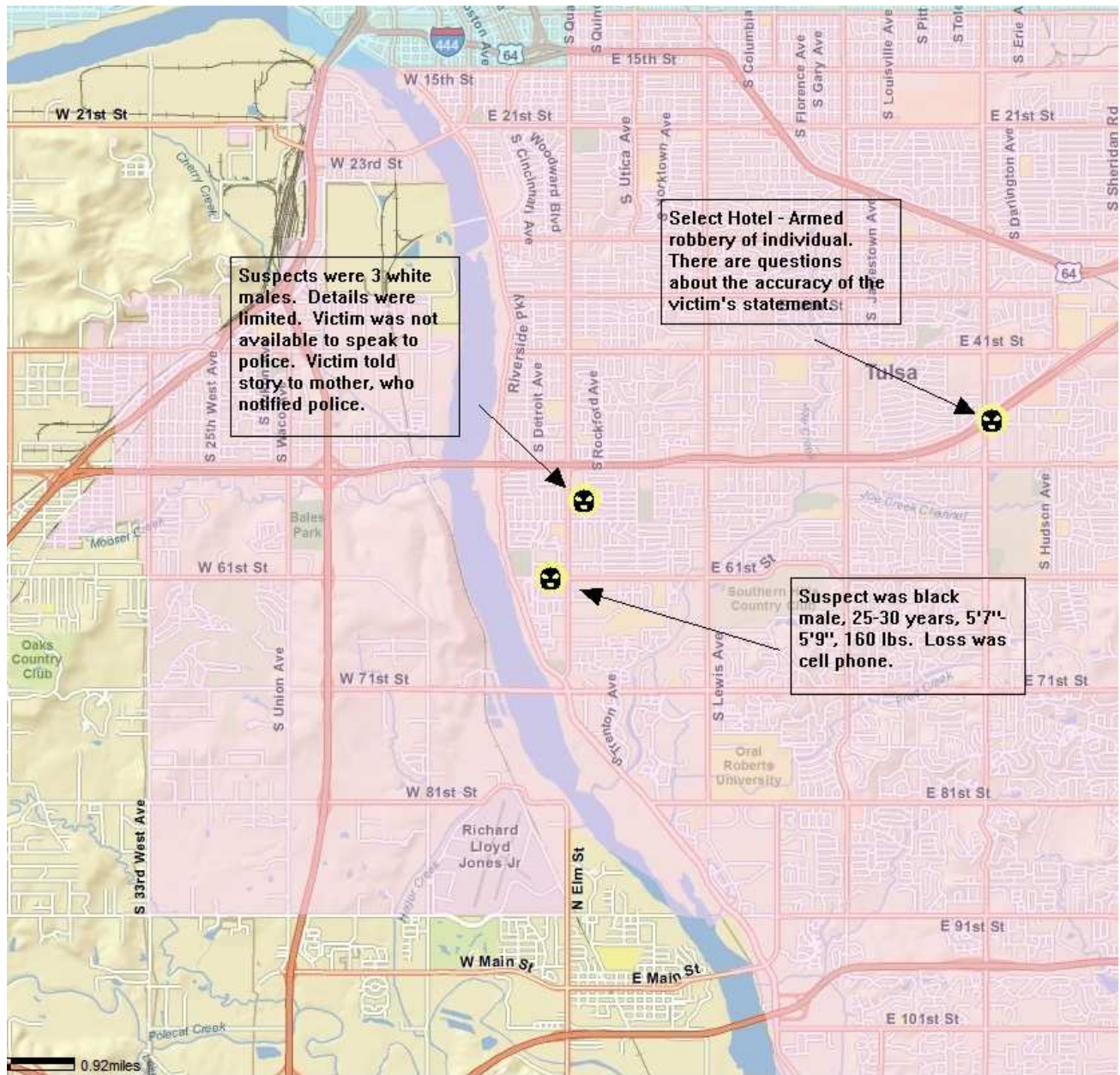

Sam is counting the days till he is on his own as a solo patrol officer. He looks forward to many years serving as a Tulsa Police Officer.

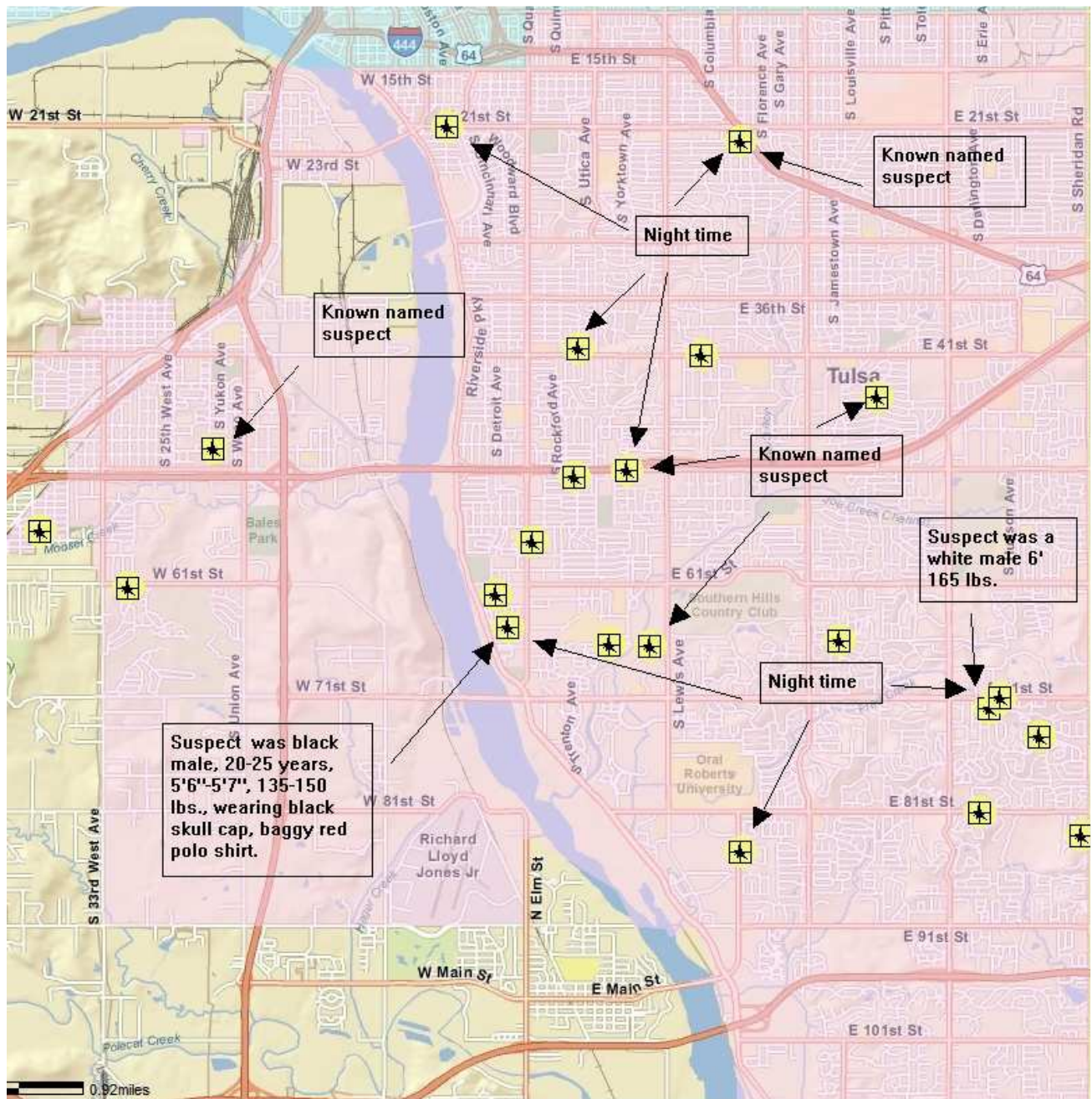

Crime Bulletin: Commercial Robbery

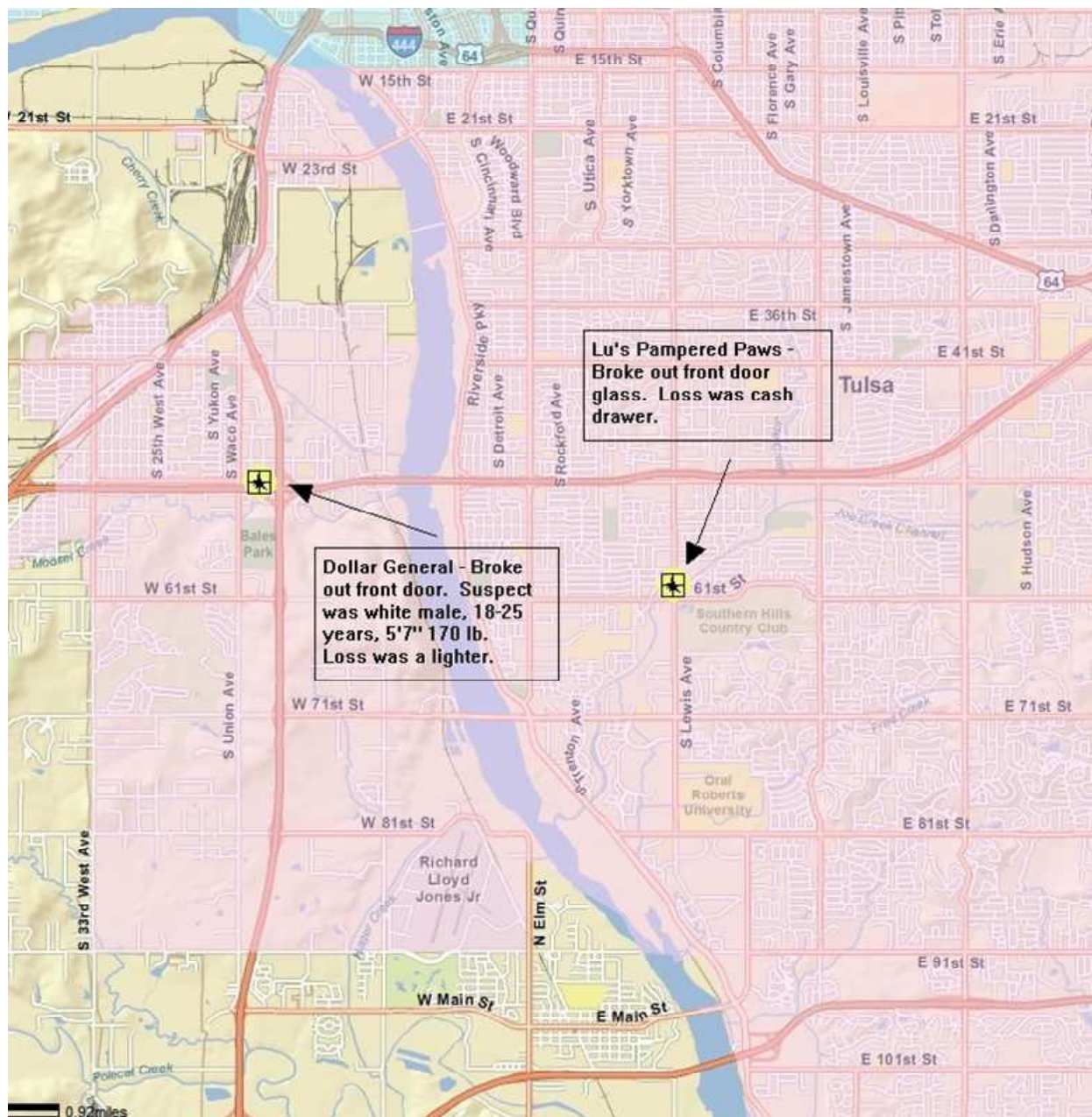
No commercial robberies were reported last week in the Riverside Division.

Crime Bulletin: Residential Burglary

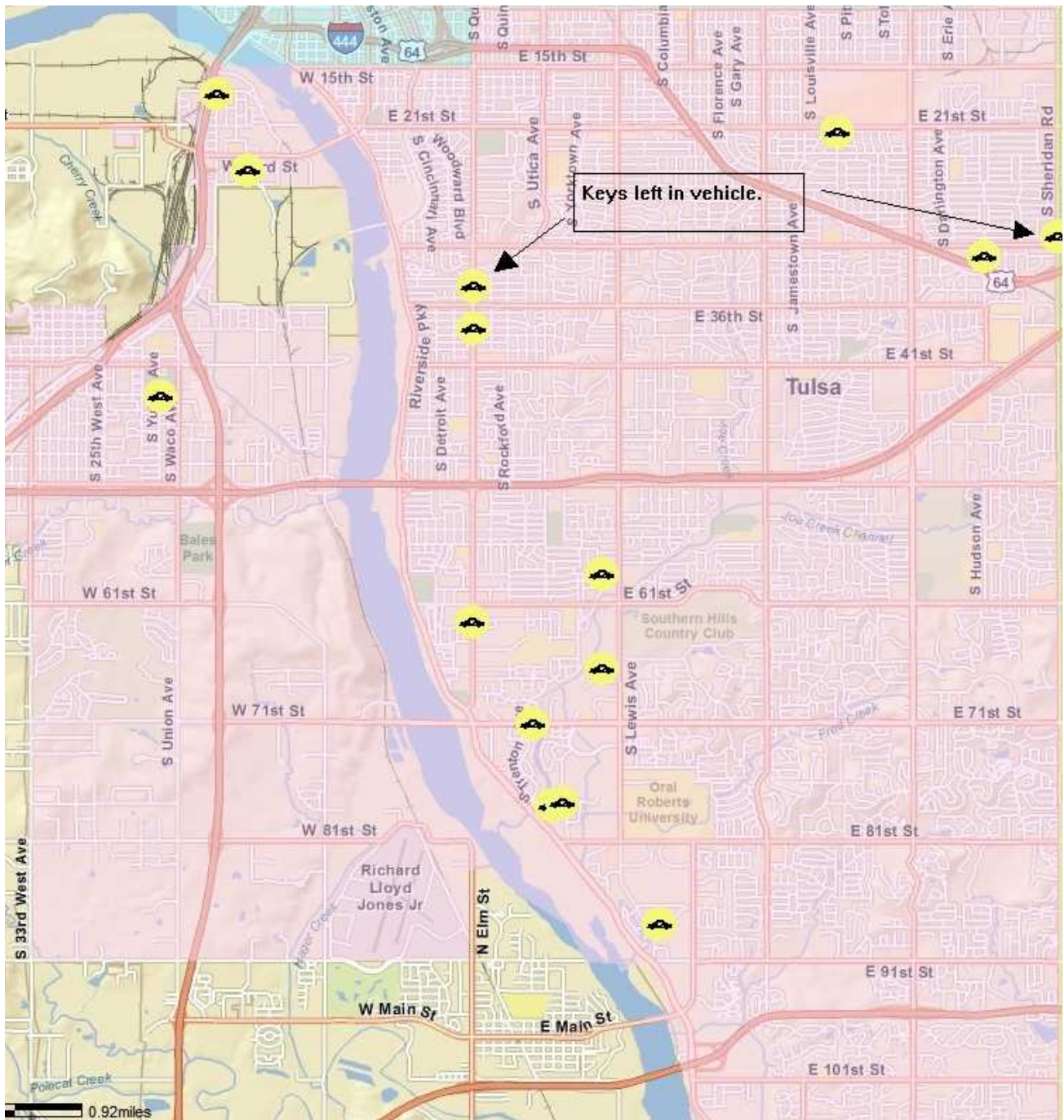


Most residential burglaries occur during the daytime when most residents are not home. We highlighted those burglaries known to have occurred at night.
