## Hard Hitting Detective Work!

Just after midnight on 10/09/2011 officers were assigned to 800 E. 46th SN in reference to a stabbing, where the suspect, Niesha Evans, had stabbed her boyfriend and another female who she believed he was cheating on her with at the time. Evans then fled the scene in a silver Chrysler PT Cruiser.



Ofc. R. Guardiola was responding to the call as he heard the suspect vehicle description. He was able to locate the vehicle and stop it at 1200 E. 46<sup>th</sup> Street North where Niesha Evans was taken into custody and interviewed by Detective Cpl. Milburn. A statement was obtained, which allowed officers to book Evans on charges of Domestic AWDW and AWDW.

## October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month!

The Detective Division's, Family Violence Unit works in a collaborative partnership at the Ann Patterson Dooley Family Safety Center. The Family Safety Center works to reduce the barriers faced by victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking who are seeking help. Centrally located in Tulsa, the FSC provides victims access to emergency protective orders and victim services in a single location.

Domestic violence and sexual assault survivors and their families can quickly and confidentially receive critical information and referrals based on individual needs. The FSC has eight (8) on-site partners, including non-profit direct service providers, advocates, prosecutors, law enforcement, and civil attorneys.
