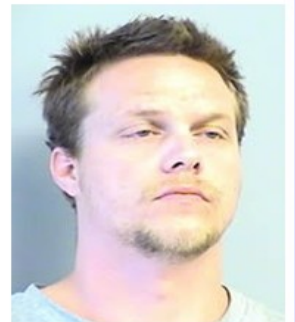
On Thursday, November 18th, at 1851 hours, the Arvest Bank, 2500 W. Edison, was robbed by a black male. Robbery Detectives were notified of the robbery via text message and found that dispatch had not been notified of the robbery at all.

Robbery Detective Max Ryden dispatched officers to the location where the suspects were headed and guided K-9 Officer Chad Murtaugh to about 4900 W. 71st Street, where suspect Tyre Whitaker, 19yo, was detained, identified as the robber and arrested.

Text-a-Tip

With more than 300,000 text messages per minute sent daily nationwide and where most active users are teenagers and young adults, Tulsa County residents, and the surrounding counties are encouraged to use this new option to text crime tips. Tipsters remain completely anonymous, and may earn a cash reward of up to \$1000 from Crime Stoppers if their information leads to an arrest. Tips are taken 24-hours a day.

1. Send Texts to "CRIMES" or "274637"
2. Begin your message with "TIP918"
3. Type your tip and hit send.
4. When the text is received, the sender will receive a PIN number within 10 seconds confirming receipt of the information.
5. The tipster will be instructed to call 9-1-1 if the tip they are reporting is in progress.

On November 18th, the Bank of America at 4800 S. Peoria was robbed when a white man came into the bank and demanded money while implying he had a gun.

Off. Jeff Olomon figured out that the suspect vehicle used in the robbery should be around the America's Value Inn, 10117 E. 11th Street. Officers and Robbery Detectives responded.

Detective Max Ryden found the suspect stayed in room #129. The occupant of room #129 was Ronald McAllister, whose ID picture at the front desk matched the suspect description.

A search warrant on the room turned up more evidence that McAllister was the same suspect who did the robbery. McAllister was arrested on Sunday, November 20th at Hillcrest Hospital, when field units were tipped off that he was there.
