Let a Sober Designated Driver be the Quarterback to Your Super Bowl Safety

The Tulsa Police Department, along with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and the National Football League (NFL), want to remind everyone who will be drinking while watching the Super Bowl on **Sunday February 4, 2012** to create a game plan to get home safely.

Nationwide in 2010, 10,228 people were killed in motor vehicle traffic crashes that involved at least one driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08 or higher.

One way to avoid impaired driving crashes is when everyone huddles up and designates a sober driver to safely transport their friends and family, who have been drinking, home.

Designated drivers should be well rested and prepared to drive any distance that is required to get their impaired passengers home safely.

Over 175,000 NFL fans have pledged to be designated drivers this season - a new record. They want to come back to support their favorite team again next year.

POLAR PLUNGE FACTS

Why Plunge? In 2011, More than 855 plungers made the Polar Plunges a huge success with over \$180,000 was raised for the 9,500 athletes of Special Olympics Oklahoma.

What is a Polar Plunge? A Polar Plunge is a fundraising challenge made to an individual or group challenging them to flying leap - a leap into the frigid waters in order to raise money for Special Olympics. Each participant collects pledges from family, friends and businesses in the hopes of raising lots of money for the local Program. Then, on a select day, they "take the plunge" in the cold water to benefit Special Olympics.

Who Can Plunge? Anyone can plunge!! Young and old. Only registered plungers will be allowed in the water. A parent or guardian must sign the waiver form if a plunger is under age 18. Attire: Anything but a wetsuit. Shoes are recommended; costumes are encouraged. Remember to bring a towel to dry off!

FROM THE CRIME ANALYST'S DESK...

FOR THE WEEKS OF 01/16 - 01/30

ROBBERIES

There were thirteen total robberies reported. Seven of the thirteen robberies were committed between noon and midnight. Sunday and Wednesday were the most popular days. Unfortunately there were no common patterns or descriptions among the suspects to aid in identification, although arrests have been made in two of the robberies.

BURGLARIES

Wednesday and Tuesday were the most popular days for reporting burglaries. 87%, or 59, of all burglaries reported were residential and 61% occurred between the hours of 6 am and 6 pm. The most common method of gaining entry remains using force on (otherwise known as "kicking") the front door. Large screen TVs and gaming devices continues to be the "hot" items most reported stolen.

AUTO THEFTS

Twenty-two vehicles and one ATV were reported stolen, and twelve of those vehicles were GM products. Reported stolen were: 13 cars, 4 trucks, 4 SUVs, and 1 ATV. 86% of the stolen vehicles were made before 2000 and 4 of them were either left running or had the keys left in them.

LARCENIES

There were sixty-two total larcenies reported. 22%, or fourteen, of all larcenies reported were from vehicles, otherwise known as burglary from vehicle. 18%, or eleven, were larcenies from retailers, otherwise known as shoplifting. The most popular day to commit a larceny during this time period was Monday, followed by Tuesday and Wednesday.
